

# RESOLUTION No. 1030

Adopted by The Sacramento City Council on date of

WHEREAS, the City Council is in receipt of a communication from Chas. W. Deterding, Jr., County Executive of Sacramento County, asking that a proposed district south of the City Limits may have permission to construct a sewer across William Land Park to a connection with a main City sewer at Land Park Drive and 11th Avenue for the purpose of carrying off sanitary sewage from said district, and which sewer would drain the slough which now runs through said William Land Park, and

WHEREAS, the construction of said sewer would benefit said City of Sacramento from a health standpoint as well as the standpoint of drainage in said Park,

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS THE SENSE OF THE CITY COUNCIL AND ITS ORDER:

That when and if said proposed district is formed, it will enter into a contract with it for a connection with said proposed sewer with its main sewer above mentioned, and will dispose of the sewage carried by said sewer; that it will also grant an easement upon a route mutually agreed upon for the said sewer through said Park.

This consent, however, is given upon the following express conditions:

That a charge of fifty cents per month for each house in said district will be made by the City of Sacramento for pumping or otherwise disposing of said sewage carried by said sewer;


That said proposed district will collect said charge and each month will pay same to the City of Sacramento;

That said sewer and its collecting system will conform to City Standards and meet the approval of the City Engineer of the City of Sacramento;

That, in the event the said district hereafter should otherwise dispose of its sewage, said sewer constructed within said Park shall become the property of said City, and the easement through said Park for same shall revert to said City.
