

RESOLUTION No. 189.

Adopted by The Sacramento City Council on date of

June 20, 1929.

WHEREAS, the City of Sacramento became at a tax sale the owner, and is in possession of, Lots Nos. 2504 and 2419 of Elmhurst as per plat thereof, situate in the said City of Sacramento, and

WHEREAS, it appears to the City Council that it is for the best interests of the City to sell same, and


WHEREAS, the said City has offered them for sale upon sealed bids after advertising according to law, to-wit; daily for five days, and

WHEREAS, Greer and Harrigan, a firm composed of Raymond Greer and James Harrigan, offered the sum of Six Hundred Seventy-five and 00/100 (\$675.00) for each of said lots, and

WHEREAS, the City Council declares that, in its judgment, is not at this time of value great enough that they can be sold for a sum equal to the amount of all taxes, interest, costs, penalties and street improvements, and that it would be for the best interests of the City to sell same for \$675.00 each,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That, in connection of the premises, it is ordered that the bid of Greer and Harrigan above mentioned be accepted for said lots and that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized and directed to make, execute and deliver the proper conveyances therefor.
