The Honorable City Council met in Regular Session on this date at 8.25 o'clock P. M., Mayor Elkus presiding and Roll Call being answered by following members of City Council:

The Minutes of Regular Meeting December 17th, 1925, were read and approved.

Upon recommendation of City Manager which was ordered filed, Councilman Kiernan moved that bid of Pacific Gas & Electric Company; submitted December 17th, for electrical current for buildings, parks, streets, etc., for the year 1926, be accepted. Seconded by Councilman John H. Miller and carried as follows:

Upon recommendation of City Manager which was ordered filed, Councilman Brown moved that bid of Great Western Power Company, submitted December 17th for current for Sewage Pumping Station No. One for year 1925, be accepted. Seconded by Councilman Kiernan and carried by following vote:

In accordance with application and recommendation of City Manager which were ordered filed, City Manager presented following Resolution, recommending adoption:- viz,

RESOLUTION NO. 693, CITY COUNCIL.

"RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Sacramento that the Pacific Gas and Electric Company be granted a revocable permit for circular terminal track system on Lots Seven and Eight in block H and I between Third and Fourth Streets, and extending from tracks of Pacific Gas and Electric Company, at intersection of Third and Eye Streets, existing under provisions of Ordinance No. 994, adopted by the Board of Trustees on date of October 16, 1911, to serve the new Southern Pacific Depot, now under construction, adjacent thereto, in blocks H and I Streets from Third to Fifth Streets, said lay-out and extension of tracks being more particularly described as follows:-

"Commencing at the southerly line of I Street at its intersection with Third Street, running thence northerly upon and across I Street and along Third Street to the southerly line of the land owned by Southern Pacific Company and used by it for depot purposes; thence easterly upon the northerly half of the public highway forming the southerly boundary of the depot property of said Southern Pacific Company, a distance of 200 feet; thence southerly upon and across said public highway to the northerly boundary of the city park situated on I Street between Third and Fifth Sts., thence southerly to the east and west centerline of the City Park; thence westerly thru said City Park to said applicant's tracks on Third Street.

in accordance with application and blueprint of track lay-out filed on this date and under provisions of Section 237 of the City Charter of the City of Sacramento, at no expense whatsoever to the City of Sacramento and upon condition that all construction work in connection therewith and paving of right-of-way therein shall be subject to the supervision of the City Manager."

"Commencing at a point in the east line of 15th Street, in the center of Southern Pacific Company's existing main track on R Street, running thence easterly thru a No. 7 turnout to the left and thence thru a 20 degree curve to the left, a distance of approximately 108 feet to a point 8½ feet southerly from the north property line of R Street; thence easterly parallel to and 8½ feet southerly from the north property line of R Street, a distance approximately fifty feet to the end of said proposed track.

"AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A CITY POUND, CREATING THE OFFICE OF POUNDKEEPER AND PROVIDING FOR ASSISTANTS TO THE POUNDKEEPER, FIXING COMPENSATION, FIXING THE AMOUNT OF BOND TO BE FILED BY POUNDKEEPER; REGULATING THE KEEPING OF HORSE, MULE, ASS, KINE, HOG, SHEEP, OR GOAT; REGULATING THE KEEPING OF DOGS AND PROVIDING FOR THEIR REGISTRATION; MAKING IT UNLAWFUL FOR DOGS TO RUN AT LARGE; PROVIDING FOR THE IMPOUNDING OF ANIMALS RUNNING AT LARGE AND THE MANNER IN WHICH SUCH ANIMALS MAY BE REDEEMED OR DISPOSED OF; REGULATING THE KEEPING OF DOGS SUSPECTED OF BEING AFFECTED WITH RABIES; MAKING IT UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON TO HARBOR OR CONCEAL A DOG RUNNING AT LARGE; FIXING THE PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE, AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 257, THIRD SERIES, ORDINANCE NO. 289, THIRD SERIES, ORDINANCE NO. 63, FOURTH SERIES, ORDINANCE NO. 116, FOURTH SERIES AND ORDINANCE NO. 129 FOURTH SERIES."

RESOLUTION NO. _____, CITY COUNCIL.

"WHEREAS, the street trees in the City of Sacramento, are a great benefit to the City and much admired by residents and visitors and,

"WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the City Council of the City of Sacramento that such trees should be removed only when the circumstances seriously demand it.

"BE IT RESOLVED that the City Manager be, and he is hereby requested to notify the City Council when the Superintendent of Parks intends to grant a permit for the removal of any street trees and,

"BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that such permits shall not be granted until such notice shall have been presented at a regular meeting of the City Council."

Discussed and upon suggestion of the Chairman, Councilman Bidwell recommended striking out of the words "intends" and "deems it advisable", and action thereon postponed until date of January 7th, 1926.

Report of Civil Service Board on Ordinance prescribing the minimum daily wages to be paid to un-skilled laborers employed by City, introduced by Councilman Kiernan on date of November 12th, 1925 was ordered filed, copies ordered furnished to each member, and thanks tendered the Board for same; Councilman Royal Miller moving that action on foregoing Ordinance be further postponed to date of January 7th, 1926. Seconded by Councilman John H. Miller.

Councilman Elkus then addressed Council to the effect that in his opinion laborers employed by the City regularly and who are subject to lay-offs on account of wet weather are entitled to \$5.00 per day and foregoing motion was carried by following vote:

City Manager presented and recommended adoption of the following Resolution:

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION NO. 2054.

"WHEREAS, in the opinion of the City Council of the City of Sacramento, the public interest and convenience require that the work and improvement hereinafter described should be done:

"NOW, THEREFORE, the said City Council does hereby resolve and declare that it is the intention of said City Council to order the following work and improvement to be done in said City.

"To close, vacate and abandon the alley between 7th Avenue and 8th Avenue, from the westerly line of Riverside Boulevard to the west boundary of the tract known as "Riviera No. 1" (as the same is shown on the official map thereof filed in the office of the County Recorder of the County of Sacramento, State of California).

"And said City Council does hereby determine and declare that the exterior boundaries of the district of lands which will be affected or benefited by said work and improvement are described as follows:

"All that property bounded by the lines of the said "Riviera Tract No. 1". Saving and excepting from the said district the area of the alley included therein.

"The entire damages, costs and expenses of said work and improvements shall be and are hereby made chargeable against and shall be assessed upon said lands.

"All of the aforesaid work and improvements shall be done in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the Legislature of the State of California entitled, "An Act to provide for laying out, opening, extending, widening, straightening or closing up, in whole or in part, any street, square, lane, alley, court or place within municipalities, and to condemn and acquire any and all land and property necessary or convenient for that purpose", approved March 6th, 1889, and the several acts amendatory thereof or supplementary thereto.

"The Street Superintendent is hereby directed to cause notices of the passage of this resolution to be printed and posted in accordance with law, and to cause a notice similar in substance to be published in accordance with law in the Sacramento Union, a daily newspaper, published and circulated in the said City of Sacramento."

Upon recommendation of City Manager, Councilman John H. Miller moved that foregoing Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Councilman Royal Miller and carried by following vote:

Mayor Elkus addressed Council stating that he would not be present the following week and the strike of the gavel would be the close of his last meeting in the capacity of Mayor; that he felt he has had the confidence of the Council and fulfilled the duties of office as far as could be expected; that he will greatly miss the company of the members when Thursday evenings arrive, expressing his belief that it was the aim of all members to advance the City's interests, although by different methods, and anticipating that the progress will continue, and after wishing the Council God-speed, Councilman Elkus highly commended the City Clerk and his deputies for their assistance to the Council, also speaking in the highest terms of the efficient manner in which the City's business has been administered under City Manager H. C. Bottorff.

Councilman John H. Miller moved that Mrs. A. E. Coolot and Mrs. J. R. Blair be re-appointed as members of the Ann Land Fund Commission for term of five years from date of January 5th, 1926. Seconded by Councilman Goddard; legality of appointment before expiration of term was questioned by Councilman Bidwell; discussed and motion was carried by following vote: AYES: Councilmen Anderson, Bidwell, Brown, Elkus, Frazier, Goddard, Kiernan, John H. Miller, Royal Miller.

"AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE USE, OPERATION OR MAINTENANCE OF ANY VENDING MACHINE IN THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO OTHER THAN THOSE DELIVERING A SPECIFIC ARTICLE OR SPECIFIC QUANTITY OF MERCHANDISE FOR A SPECIFIC PRICE; PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE AND MAKING THIS ORDINANCE AN EMERGENCY MEASURE TO TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY."

Councilman Goddard moved that leave of absence of ten days be granted Councilman Bidwell at his request, with permission to leave the State and motion carried by following vote; having been seconded by Councilman Brown:

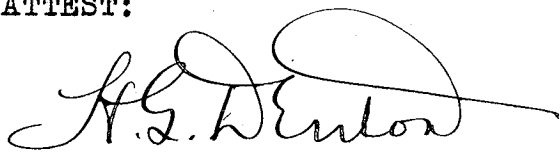
December 24th, 1925.
