

THE HONORABLE CITY COUNCIL,
CITY OF SACRAMENTO,
SPECIAL MEETING,
JANUARY 20th,
1925.

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Pursuant to action of City Council on date of January 8th, 1925 and Call issued by the Mayor which was ordered filed, stating meeting to be held for the purpose of discussing petition of property owners and residents in East Sacramento for extension of street car service filed November 6th, 1924, the Honorable City Council met in Special Session on this date at hour of 3:45 o'clock P. M., Mayor Elkus presiding and Roll Call being answered by following members of the Council:

Anderson, Bidwell, Elkus, Frazier, Kiernan, John H. Miller.

Call for the Meeting was read and ordered filed.

City Manager addressed Council stating that four applications had been filed for extension of street car service; viz, East of McKinley Park, East Sacramento, Southeast of Oak Park and Freeport Boulevard districts; that six conferences had been held with officials of Pacific Gas & Electric Company and that he had recommended the holding of this meeting in order that the entire Council might discuss the question.

Mr. P. M. Downing, Vice President of the Pacific Gas & Electric Company addressed Council and presented a report showing the following:

Service rendered by several street car systems in California.

Operating expense and statistics of the Sacramento System.

Analysis of Motor Bus operation in this City.

Trend of Street railway affairs in American Cities.

Together with Charts covering foregoing subjects.

Report was ordered filed.

The following addressed Council requesting extension of car lines to serve the respective districts:

Mr. and Mrs. J. W. Keller and W. B. Fink, representing district East of McKinley Park.

A. G. Crell, G. H. Platt, D. W. Milne and Frank E. Dolan, representing East Sacramento District and East Portal Club.

Eugene Benjamin, district in vicinity of New High School, Oak Park.

B. Edwards, representing district of Freeport Boulevard.

Discussed at considerable length and upon recommendation of City Manager, Councilman John H. Miller moved that a Committee of representatives of the City Council, including City Manager, one member of each district or club requesting service, together with representatives of the Pacific Gas & Electric Company be appointed by the Chair to confer further in matter. Seconded by Mayor Elkus; Councilman Bidwell stating that Anderson objected to motion, contending that matter should be determined by City Manager and motion was adopted by following vote:

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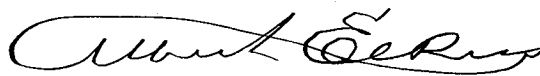
