SUMMARY

Bids were received from five (5) contractors and opened by the City Clerk on June 28, 2000. The low bidder was Florez Paving who met the ESBE goals. It is therefore proposed to award the contract to Florez Paving for \$229,227.50.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Ten intersections within the Downtown area were chosen to be upgraded as part of the yearly Combined System Drain Inlet Replacement Project. The scope of work was been extended to include the construction of double historic access ramps per ADA requirements. This project also includes the construction of a sewer main and the replacement of existing maintenance holes.

Bids were received from five(5) contractors, as follows:

- Florez Paving \$229,227.50
- Jaeger Construction \$237,200.00
- Con-Star \$275,678.00
- JJM Engineers \$351,445.00
- Navajo Pipelines \$368,740.00

The engineer's estimated construction cost was \$255,000.00. The estimated completion date is September 22, 2000.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

The total project cost including design, construction, inspection, and contingency is \$294,557. There are sufficient funds in the project to complete the contract.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS

The Environmental Services Division has determined that this project is categorically exempt pursuant to State Class 1 and 2 and Section Number 15302(c) of the California Environmental Quality Act.

POLICY CONSIDERATION

This action is consistent with Chapter 58, Article III, Section 58.304 of the City Code concerning award of contracts.

This project included participation goals of 20% for emerging and small business enterprises as required by Ordinance 99-007 and Resolution 99-055, relating to ESBD participation goals and policies, adopted by the City Council on February 9, 1999. The responsive low bidder, Florez paving exceeded the ESBE goals with a participation level of 99.26%.
