

RESOLUTION No. 292

Adopted by The Sacramento City Council on date of

February 21, 1947,

WHEREAS, on October 10, 1941, there was executed by and between WALTER J. BROWNE, owner and operator of the Browne Flying Service, a certain lease agreement with the City of Sacramento by the terms of which the City of Sacramento granted to Walter J. Browne, as first party, a certain plot of ground to be designated by the Superintendent of the Municipal Airport, upon which he was given the right to build and operate an aircraft and engineering repair shop, student class room and office at said municipal airport, and that pursuant to this lease Mr. Browne erected a building thereon, which, under the terms thereof, he has a right to remove at the expiration of the lease, and further that said lease was for a period of five (5) years, beginning on the 10th day of October, 1941, and that shortly after the execution of this lease war was declared and the United States Government took charge of the Sacramento Municipal Airport and further commercial flying was suspended, and that Mr. Browne was barred from further use of the facilities there under the terms of his lease with the City, and he has made request to the City Council that adjustments be made owing to the fact that he was prevented from using this building during the war; and

WHEREAS, the matter was referred to the City Manager and it is his recommendation that the agreement entered into between the City and Mr. Browne be extended to and including October 10, 1950, under the same terms and conditions as provided in the lease,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

That the terms of the lease which was entered into by the City with Mr. Browne on October 10, 1941, and suspended from its operation during the war, upon recommendation of the City Manager, be extended to October 10, 1950, under the same terms and conditions as provided in the said lease.
