**SUBJECT: Authorization to Accept Increased Grant Funding For the Development of a Metropolitan Medical Response System (MMRS)**

**LOCATION/COUNCIL DISTRICT:** Citywide

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt the attached resolution.

**SUMMARY:**

On July 20, 1999, the City Council adopted a resolution approving the acceptance of a \$400,000 grant from the Department of Health and Human Services. This grant was for the development of a Metropolitan Medical Response System (MMRS). Additional grant funding has been made available to fully fund the project. The City of Sacramento has been selected to receive an additional \$200,000 in grant funding.

**BACKGROUND:**

The City Council approved the acceptance of the initial grant funding of \$400,000 to begin the development of a MMRS. Upon review of the requirements of the program, the Department of Health and Human Services found there was not enough funding allocated to develop the biological component of the program. An additional \$200,000 has been offered to plan, develop, and purchase

special pharmaceuticals and equipment. The amendment to the agreement is available for review in the Office of the City Clerk. The MMRS is being developed to provide a local response to the health and medical consequences of a nuclear and chemical terrorist incident and with the additional funds, support the mitigation of a biological event.

**FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:**

The additional grant funding of \$200,000 will bring the total for this grant to \$600,000. The grant requires no matching funds. These monies will not provide for the upkeep and maintenance of equipment and supplies purchased.

**ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS:**

This report proposes no changes in the existing Emergency Medical Services and Hazardous Materials operations.


**POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:**
