

THE HONORABLE CITY COUNCIL
CITY OF SACRAMENTO,
REGULAR MEETING,
DECEMBER 26th,
1924.

The Honorable City Council met in Regular Session on this date at 8.25 o'clock P. M., President Pro Tem Frazier presiding and Roll Call being answered by following members of City Council:-

Anderson, Bidwell, Frazier, Goddard, Kiernan, John H. Miller.

The Minutes of Regular Meeting of December 18th, 1924 were read and approved.

In accordance with report of City Manager, Councilman Kiernan moved that application of T. Hashimoto for transfer of Pool & Billiard License now held by Allie & Abraham, 1013 Third Street, be granted. Seconded by Councilman John H. Miller and carried by following vote:

City Manager recommending its approval, Councilman John H. Miller moved that application of S. Sumida for transfer to him of Pool & Non-Intoxicating Alcoholic Beverage License now held by D. Yamada at premises 1013 - 2nd Street be granted. Seconded by Councilman Kiernan and carried by following vote:

City Manager submitting report thereon, Councilman Kiernan moved that specifications for furnishing of electrical current and electrical equipment for streets, parks, public buildings, city departments, Sump No. 1 and 2 and for the furnishing of power for the Filtration Plant be approved and the City Clerk be directed to advertise for bids to be received January 2nd, 1925. Seconded by Councilman Bidwell and carried by following vote:

ABSENT: Brown, Elkus, Royal Miller.

Report of City Manager relative to protest of property owners versus installation of a gasoline pump and tank on the premises owned by Peters Draying Company between 17th and 18th on T Streets, was ordered filed.

Report was presented by City Manager relative to break in the 54 inch conduit near its entrance into the sedimentation basin structure of the Filtration Plant, recommending that he be authorized to proceed with repair of said break with equipment now on hand.

Councilman Goddard thereupon moved that recommendation be approved and the City Manager be authorized to proceed with the work. Seconded by Councilman Kiernan.

City Manager addressed Council stating that two or three plans for repairing had been looked into by himself and City Engineer and although the cost for the plan

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submitted would be slightly more, it is the most practical plan and proper step to take.

Councilman Anderson addressed Council, objecting to the expenditure of such an amount at this time, owing to the fact that the entire structure may have to be replaced at a later date.

Henry D. Dewell enlightened Council as to the practicability of the proposed plan stating it was the most logical method and that the expenditure was not very large. Stating also that he did not make personal investigation but received information from Engineering Department.

Councilman Royal Miller arrived.

Petition of Livingston and Baker requesting permit to install sidewalk gasoline pump at premises 2719 - Sacramento Boulevard was referred to City Manager for report.

Councilman Elkus arrived.

Communication from Mrs. W. C. Hall recommending Mrs. A. C. Hart as member of Ann Land Fund Commission vice Mrs. Orin B. Whipple, resigned, was ordered filed.

Councilman Goddard thereupon nominated Mrs. A. C. Hart as member of Ann Land Fund Commission, vice Mrs. Orin B. Whipple, resigned. Seconded by Councilman Anderson.

The Chair ruling that nominations not being in order at this time, motion was declared out of order.

Communication from Daughters of the American Revolution expressing their appreciation of Council's action in setting aside tract of land in William Land Park for a Memorial Grove, was ordered filed.

No protests having been received, City Manager presented following Resolution:

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to the extent, with the materials and in the manner set forth in Resolution of Intention No. 1941, passed and adopted by said City Council on December 4th, 1924, reference to which Resolution of Intention is hereby made for a description of said work and of the district to be assessed for the costs and expenses of said work.

The City Clerk is hereby directed to post conspicuously for five days on or near the Council Chamber door of the City Council notice hereof, with specifications, inviting sealed proposals or bids for doing said work, and referring to the specifications posted and on file, the said publication to be in the Sacramento Star, a daily newspaper published and circulated in said City of Sacramento and hereby designated for that purpose.

All such proposals or bids shall be received by the City Clerk, at the Council Chamber of the City Council, in the City Hall of said City, on the 8th day of January, 1925 between the hour of 8.00 o'clock P. M., and the hour of 9.00 o'clock P. M., and said day is hereby designated as the day on which at the hour of 9.00 o'clock P. M., the said proposals or bids shall be opened, all of which shall be specified in said notice, and said notice shall required with said proposals or bids a check certified by a responsible bank, payable to the City of Sacramento, for an amount not less than (10%) of the aggregate of the proposal, or by a bond for the said amount, and so payable, signed by the bidder and two sureties, all as prescribed by lay."
