"WHEREAS, the contract between the City of Sacramento and The Gamewell Company for the construction of above project provides that the same shall be completed in 270 calendar days with no provision for any money to be paid as liquidated damages for each day over the time specified for completion, and

"WHEREAS, the work being of an unusual tupe, because of which, for causes beyond the control of the contractor, the work of completion has been delayed, and

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"WHEREAS, the contractor has asked for an extension of the contract time for 72 days, in addition to the time already granted,

"NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO, after due consideration:

"That the stipulation of time of completion in the contract is hereby waived,

"BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED AND ORDERED that the contractor have an additional 72 calendar days with which to complete said contract, same being considered a reasonable time."

"BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Controller make available the sum of \$3,750 to purchase Lots 7 and 8 and, in the event the City takes up the above mentioned options, to make available in the respective years the respective amounts specified as purchase price."

that certain improvements are proposed to be done and made within the boundaries of the proposed assessment district hereinafter described.

"In connection therewith, said City Council hereby finds and determines as follows, to-wit:

"1. That the nature of the proposed improvement consists of improving the right-of-way along the rear of Lots 2501 to 2514, both inclusive, in "Oak Terrace" (as the same is shown on the official map or plat thereof filed in the office of the County Recorder of the County of Sacramento, State of California), from a point approximately 120 feet east of 33rd Street, to the sewer in place along the rear of said Lot 2514; by excavating a trench and constructing therein an eight (8) inch vitrified ironstone pipe sewer, with six (6) inch flusher branch at west end, and one manhole complete with cast iron curb and cover; and backfilling the trench.

"2. The location and extent of the proposed improvement will involve the construction of the above described improvements upon the following described right-of-way within the boundaries of the proposed assessment district hereinafter described, to-wit:

"Right-of-way along the rear of Lots 2501 to 2514, both inclusive, in "Oak Terrace" (as the same is shown on the official map or plat thereof filed in the office of the County Recorder of the County of Sacramento, State of California), from a point approximately 120 feet east of 33rd Street, to the sewer in place along the rear of said Lot 2514.

"3. The boundaries of the district of lands proposed to be specially assessed to pay the costs and expenses of such proposed work and improvement are generally defined as follows, to-wit:

"Commencing at a point on the easterly line of 33rd Street 150 feet north of the northerly line of 6th Avenue; thence easterly along a line parallel with the northerly line of 6th Avenue, to the northeast corner of Lot 2514 in said "Oak Terrace"; thence southerly along the easterly line of said Lot 2514, to the northerly line of 6th Avenue; thence westerly along the northerly line of 6th Avenue, to the southwest corner of Lot 2504, in said "Oak Terrace"; thence northerly along the westerly line of said Lot 2504, to the southeast corner of Lot 2501, in said "Oak Terrace"; thence westerly along the southerly line of said Lot 2501, to the easterly line of 33rd Street; thence northerly along the easterly line of 33rd Street, to the point of beginning.

"4. That the amount and portion of the cost of such proposed improvement proposed to be paid by the City of Sacramento from any source other than special assessments upon benefited property is nil.

"5. The statute under which it is proposed to conduct proceedings for the proposed improvement is the "Improvement Act of 1911," with bonds to be issued as authorized under the "Improvement Bond Act of 1915;" said bonds to bear interest at the rate of six (6) per cent per annum.

"BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Engineer is hereby directed to prepare for this Council a written Report upon the proposed improvement, such Report to contain all the information required by Section 3 of the "Special Assessment Investigation, Limitation and Majority Protest Act of 1931," approved June 8, 1931, and the several acts amendatory thereof or supplemental thereto."

Councilman Truesdale moved that the foregoing Resolution be adopted. Seconded by Councilman Anderson and carried by the following vote:

"WHEREAS, the services of Mr. Roche was secured to our City because of the excellent record of Mr. Roche and his experience and extraordinary ability in matters pertaining to police administration; and

"WHEREAS, the result of the leadership and direction of Mr. Roche has placed the Sacramento Police Department and the men constituting the police force on a high plane of efficiency and organization; and

"WHEREAS, Mr. Roche has of his own accord and initiative presented his resignation to Mr. James S. Dean, City Manager, which said resignation has, upon the insistence of Mr. Roche, been accepted by Mr. Dean;

"NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that we, the City Council of the City of Sacramento do hereby record ourselves as being regretful of the fact that Mr. Roche is leaving the employ of this City, and that our regret is based on the fact that his services have been most excellent, and his ability and honesty constitute him a man of high qualifications as a police executive, and

"BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Council now has and at all times has had unlimited confidence in said Austin J. Roche, and we express to him our appreciation of his services to the City of Sacramento.

Seconded by Councilman Arnold and carried by the following vote:

AYES: Councilmen Anderson, Arnold, Bidwell, Coughlin, Harry, Kunz, Monk, Truesdale, Welsh.

Claim of Frederick Clement Coz and Fawn Patricia Coz, in the amount of \$50,000.00, as compensation and damages for alleged injury received by said claimants due to an automobile accident with a City owned truck, was ordered filed and referred to the City Manager for Report.

Oath of Office of Alexander Monk as Special Police Officer of California Packing Corporation, Plant #12, was read and ordered filed.

Before Adjournment Council carefully compared bids received on this date with record kept by City Clerk and found record and bids to be similar in every particular.
