

MINUTES OF CIVIL SERVICE BOARD

The Civil Service Board met in special session in the office of the Board at 8:30 P.M., President Chenu presiding.

Mr. Wise appeared before the Board in response to notice sent because of his application being misplaced by the office force at time of sending out other notices. After interview and examination by the Board, his grade was computed and his name was ordered to be placed in its proper position upon the eligible register.

LAPP, WALTER F.

Mr. Lapp, who had taken the Patrolman's examination, appeared at the office for measurement. Board members measured his height and due to the uncertainty of the correctness of the tape measure used, the Secretary was instructed to have the City Physician officially measure his height.

RECLASSIFICATION  
Ward, Glenn

Mr. Ward was given a Tractor Operator's classification upon the 1928 List, and in order that his classification should conform to his duties and the newly established classification, Commissioner Stacy moved that he be reclassified as a Power Driven Equipment Operator. Seconded by Commissioner Deise and unanimously carried.

After review and discussion, Commissioner Deise moved that the reports be approved. Seconded by Commissioner Stacy and unanimously carried.


SERGEANTS OF POLICE  
 SENIORITY

The Secretary presented a letter from City Attorney Hugh B. Bradford dated March 5, 1936, wherein Mr. Bradford stated in part that"...The matter of seniority or lack of seniority is now an established fact. In the event of a future controversy over the matter, the courts only could give a decisive interpretation.... If an actual case involving a demotion arises, I will endeavor, with the aid of your Secretary, to work out a solution; of course, if any solution at which we arrive is not satisfactory, the matter can, and probably will, be taken to court." After discussion the letter was ordered filed.
