Title: Administrative Matter: Correction to Resolution No. 2007-187 Approving the Application for Land and Water Conservation Fund Renovation of the Group Picnic Area at Southside Park

Recommendation: That City Council amend Resolution No. 2007-187 approving the application for Land and Water Conservation Fund Renovation of the Group Picnic Area at Southside Park to incorporate additional language required by the State of California Department of Parks and Recreation.

Description/Analysis

Issue: On April 3, 2007, Council adopted Resolution No. 2007-187 approving the Application for Land and Water Conservation Fund Renovation of the Group Picnic Area at Southside Park.

Staff submitted the project application and proposal for the renovation of the group picnic area at Southside Park to the State of California Department of Parks and Recreation ahead of the May 1, 2007 deadline. Staff has been since advised by the grantor, State of California Department of Parks and Recreation, that the resolution be revised to include additional language as follows:

WHEREAS, the proposed Renovation of the Group Picnic Area at Southside Park Project is consistent with the Statewide Comprehensive Recreation Resources Plan California Outdoor Recreation Plan – 2002.

The Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) Program funds projects related to outdoor recreational activities and indoor facilities that support outdoor recreational activities. The types of projects that are most often funded are those related to development and rehabilitation of trails, picnic areas and open field areas.

Policy Considerations: Providing parks and recreation facilities is consistent with the City's strategic plan to enhance livability in Sacramento's neighborhoods by expanding park and recreation facilities throughout the City.

Environmental Considerations: Not applicable.

Commission/Committee Action: The Parks and Recreation Commission (PRC) supported staff's recommendation to prepare a LWCF grant proposal for the renovation of the Southside Park picnic area at its March 1, 2007 meeting.

Rationale for Recommendation: The format of this resolution is dictated by State Parks and the addition of this language does not in anyway change the intent of Resolution No. 2007-187 previously approved by City Council.

Financial Considerations: The LWCF program requires a 50% match of the total project budget as proposed in the grant application. A grant award of \$200,000 requires a \$200,000 match, making the total project budget for the grant proposal \$400,000. Development of Southside Park is one of staff's recommended projects for the 2008 Capital Improvement Program (CIP).

Emerging Small Business Development (ESBD): Not applicable at this time as no goods or services are being procured as a result of support for a Land and Water Conservation Fund grant application.



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BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The Land and Water Conservation Fund provides funding to federal agencies, and to the 50 states and 6 territories. Funds from the program are derived from federal recreation fees, sales of federal surplus real property, the federal motorboat fuel tax and the Outer Continental Shelf mineral receipts. The money allocated to the states may be used for statewide planning and for acquiring and developing outdoor recreation areas and facilities. California's allocation for last year was \$12 million. This year's allocation is expected to be \$7.8 million. About \$4.2 million will be available for grants to local agencies: 60% for Southern California (\$2.5 million) and 40% for Northern California (\$1.7 million). Cities, counties and special districts are eligible to apply.

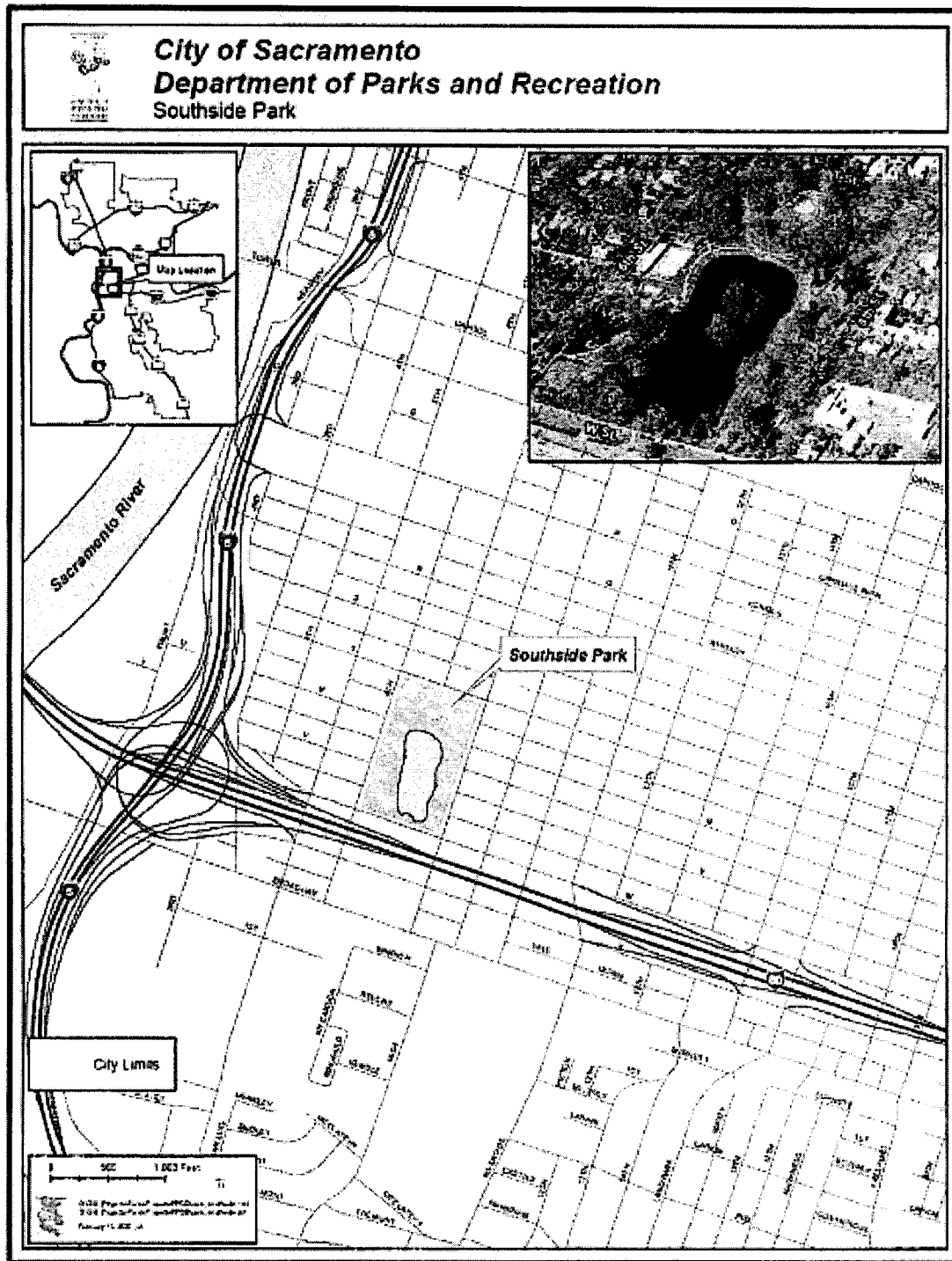
The program is a reimbursement grant program and requires a dollar for dollar match. If a jurisdiction is successful in obtaining funding, that jurisdiction is awarded 50% of the total project cost. However, at the time of application the local jurisdiction is required to be able to fully fund the proposed project as described in the grant proposal. The project also requires that all environmental documents be completed in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).

Staff evaluated a number of projects from both the existing Capital Improvement Program (CIP) and the City Council approved 2006 Parks and Recreation Programming Guide (PRPG). Based upon the grant criteria, the renovation of the group picnic area at Southside Park was determined to be a competitive project. The renovation of the Southside Park Picnic Area is a priority project because it is a top-scoring project in the 2006 PRPG partially due to the dilapidated picnic areas.

Furthermore, the project is competitive based upon the program criteria in that:

1. The project meets a statewide recreational need;
2. The project has been through a community process;
3. The project has the available 50% match;
4. The project is consistent with local plans;
5. There is easy public access to the facility; and
6. The requested amount is appropriate to the total amount available to Northern California Agencies.

The proposed project's scope is to renovate the existing group picnic area in the northwest corner of Southside Park to include: new picnic tables, new individual and group barbecues, permanent trash and recycling receptacles, a drinking fountain, concrete paving and decomposed granite, and new plantings including irrigation modifications.

Appoints the City Manager, Assistant City Manager, or Parks and Recreation Director, or Administrative Services Manager as agent of the Applicant to conduct all negotiations and execute and submit all documents, including, but not limited to, Applications, contracts, amendments, payment requests, and compliance with all applicable current state and federal laws which may be necessary for the completion of the aforementioned Project.
