

ORDINANCE NO. 996, FOURTH SERIES

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING OBSTRUCTION OF SIDEWALKS AND ENTRANCES TO PLACES OF BUSINESS. PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE; AND MAKING THIS ORDINANCE AN EMERGENCY MEASURE TO TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF

SACRAMENTO:

SECTION 1: No person, as owner or manager, or the agent or employee thereof, of any place of business where goods, wares or merchandise is sold, shall conduct or manage said place of business in a manner so as to hinder or obstruct the free passage of pedestrians along a sidewalk, or so as to block the entrance and/or prevent free ingress and egress into any other place of business.

SECTION 2: Any persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not exceeding Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars, or by imprisonment in the City Jail not to exceed six (6) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 3: This ordinance is hereby made an emergency measure and shall take effect immediately; such emergency being that by the manner of conducting a certain business sidewalks are being obstructed and other merchants are being injured.
