

MINUTES OF CIVIL SERVICE BOARD
CITY OF SACRAMENTO
SPECIAL MEETING

February 8, 1934.

The Civil Service Board met in special session in the office of the Board, Room 106 City Hall, at 1:15 o'clock P.M., Vice-President Deise presiding.

PRESENT: Commissioners Stacy, Chenu and Vice-President Deise.
ABSENT : None.

Former President Weisman appeared, introducing Commissioner Joseph T. Stacy, appointed by the City Council at its meeting of January 25, 1934, by Resolution No. 9, his term to expire December 31, 1939, and addressed the Board. Mr. Weisman stated that the Council was to be congratulated on selecting Dr. Stacy and that it was with the greatest of pleasure that he had the opportunity of introducing him to the Board. Mr. Weisman expressed his deep regret upon leaving the pleasant associations with the Board members.

Commissioner Stacy thanked Mr. Weisman for his remarks and expressed his desire to live up to all that was expected of him.

Vice-President Deise and Commissioner Chenu both expressed their regret that Mr. Weisman was no longer to be with them, and Commissioner Deise particularly remarked about the courteous treatment extended to all people and employees who felt it necessary to bring their complaints before the Board.

Mr. Weisman requested to be excused from the meeting.

Vice-President Deise opened the nomination for the office of President. It was moved by Commissioner Chenu, seconded by Com-

missioner Stacy and unanimously carried, that Vice-President Deise be elected to the office of President.

The President then called for nominations for the office of Vice-President.

It was moved by Commissioner Stacy, seconded by Commissioner Deise, that the name of Commissioner Chenu be placed in nomination for the office of Vice-President. The vote was unanimously carried. Commissioner Chenu was thereupon declared elected Vice-President.

TRUCK DRIVERS - SENIORITY
IN WASTE REMOVAL DIVISION

Mr. W. J. McQuillan, Superintendent of the Waste Removal Department, appeared before the Board to discuss seniority of Truck Drivers in the Street Cleaning Division. He explained that it had become necessary to lay-off one or two Truck Drivers and wished an expression from the Board as to whether seniority should be confined to employees in the Street Cleaning Division or if all the Truck Drivers in the city service should be included in determining seniority of appointment.

After discussion, it was concluded that the Superintendent of the Street Cleaning Division had no jurisdiction over employees in other departments and hence should confine lay offs to his own division.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting adjourned at 2:30 o'clock P.M. to meet again at the call of the Chair.
