Steve Peterson, Senior Planner spoke on this item. He stated that the Planning Commission approved this item with an amendment that the vacancy rate findings be published twice a year. In essence if an area exceeds 5% vacancy rate, this ordinance allows application to convert structures from rentals to condominiums. A discussion followed to clarify some of the ramifications of the ordinance.


Committee member Fargo thought that the language did not reflect the present situation - which is to achieve a balance between the rental and owner ratio in the City. In reality, it prohibits condominium conversion in older homes.


Council member Robie suggested bringing the ordinance itself back to Council to debate it.

Mr. Peterson stated that Planning will be coming back to Committee with a report which deals with the City wide issue and the issue in terms of Central City.

It was MOVED by Committee member Kastanis and SECONDED by Committee member Fargo to approve staff recommendation. The motion carried as noted above.
