

ORDINANCE NO. 1471, FOURTH SERIES.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 304, FOURTH SERIES, PASSED FEBRUARY 25, 1926, AND ENTITLED: "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING TRAVEL, TRAFFIC, AND PARKING UPON THE STREETS AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES LAID OUT FOR THE USE OF VEHICLES AND PEDESTRIANS IN THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO; DEFINING THE TERMS USED IN THIS ORDINANCE, CREATING CERTAIN TRAFFIC DISTRICTS IN THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO; FIXING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE, AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 80, FOURTH SERIES, PASSED JUNE 22ND, 1922, AND ALL ORDINANCES AMENDATORY THEREOF," BY ADDING NEW SECTIONS THERETO TO BE NUMBERED SECTIONS 33 (a), 33 (b) and 33 (c), AND MAKING THIS ORDINANCE AN EMERGENCY MEASURE TO TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY.  
BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

SECTION 1: Ordinance No. 304, Fourth Series, passed February 25, 1926, is hereby amended by adding new sections thereto to be numbered Sections 33 (a), 33 (b) and 33 (c), to read as follows:

Section 33 (a) LEAVING VEHICLE IN STREET FOR MORE THAN 120 HOURS PROHIBITED. It shall be unlawful for any person to park or leave standing, or cause to be parked or left standing, any vehicle upon any public street in the City of Sacramento for 120 or more consecutive hours.

Section 33 (b) WHEN VEHICLES MAY BE REMOVED FROM STREETS. Any regular employed and salaried police officer of the Police Department of the City of Sacramento may remove, or cause to be removed, any vehicle that has been parked or left standing upon a street or highway for 120 or more consecutive hours and arrange for storage of said vehicle in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance and also Section 585 of the California Vehicle Code.

VEHICLES MAY BE STORED. Any officer removing a vehicle from the streets of the City of Sacramento shall remove said vehicle to the nearest garage or other place of safety, or a garage designated or maintained by the City of Sacramento as the official garage for removal of all of said vehicles taken from the streets under the provisions of this ordinance and also the California Vehicle Code.

NOTICE REQUIRED UPON REMOVAL. In the event an officer removes a vehicle from the Streets of the City of Sacramento as herein provided, such officer shall give the notices required by Section 585 of the Vehicle Code.

SECTION 33 (c) GARAGE TO HAVE A LIEN. The keeper of any garage in which any vehicle is stored or removed

to and in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance and the Vehicle Code, shall have a lien thereon for his compensation for towage and for caring for and keeping safe such vehicle and may satisfy such lien in compliance with and under the conditions stated in Section 585 of the Vehicle Code of the State of California.

SECTION 2: This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect immediately; such emergency being the necessity of authorizing the Police Department to impound automobiles parked for 120 or more consecutive hours upon the streets of the City of Sacramento for the protection of the public safety and welfare.
