**SUBJECT: RESOLUTION ANNEXING A PORTION OF V STREET INTO THE U.C.D.
MEDICAL CENTER RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA**

V Street from 51st to 52nd Streets. Council District 5.

This report recommends that the City Council adopt the attached resolution annexing a portion of V Street from 51st to 52nd Streets into the U.C.D. Medical Center residential permit parking area.

SUMMARY:

This report recommends annexing a portion of V Street from 51st to 52nd Streets into the U.C.D. Medical Center residential permit parking area (Exhibit A). Prohibiting parking on this street will relieve the parking congestion generated by area employees and make it easier for residents to park near their homes.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

- The U.C.D. Medical Center residential permit parking area was established in August 1980.
- Parking congestion is increasing on some streets adjacent to the permit parking area and residents are having difficulty parking near their homes.
- Residents along a portion of V Street have requested annexation into the residential permit parking area.
- Parking on the annexed streets will be prohibited Monday through Friday from 8 am to 6 pm.
- Residents and their guests will be exempt from the parking regulation when the proper permit is displayed.
- A letter was sent to all of the residents which outlined the request and solicited comments. There was no opposition to the proposal.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The cost to implement the recommended parking regulation is estimated to be \$500 for the installation of regulatory signs. Funds are available in the Street Division, Traffic Signs and Markings operating budget.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The Neighborhoods, Planning and Development Services Department, Office of Environmental Affairs has reviewed the project and has determined that this project is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under Section 15301(c) of the CEQA guidelines

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:

This recommendation is consistent with the City Council priority of neighborhood revitalization and enhancement.

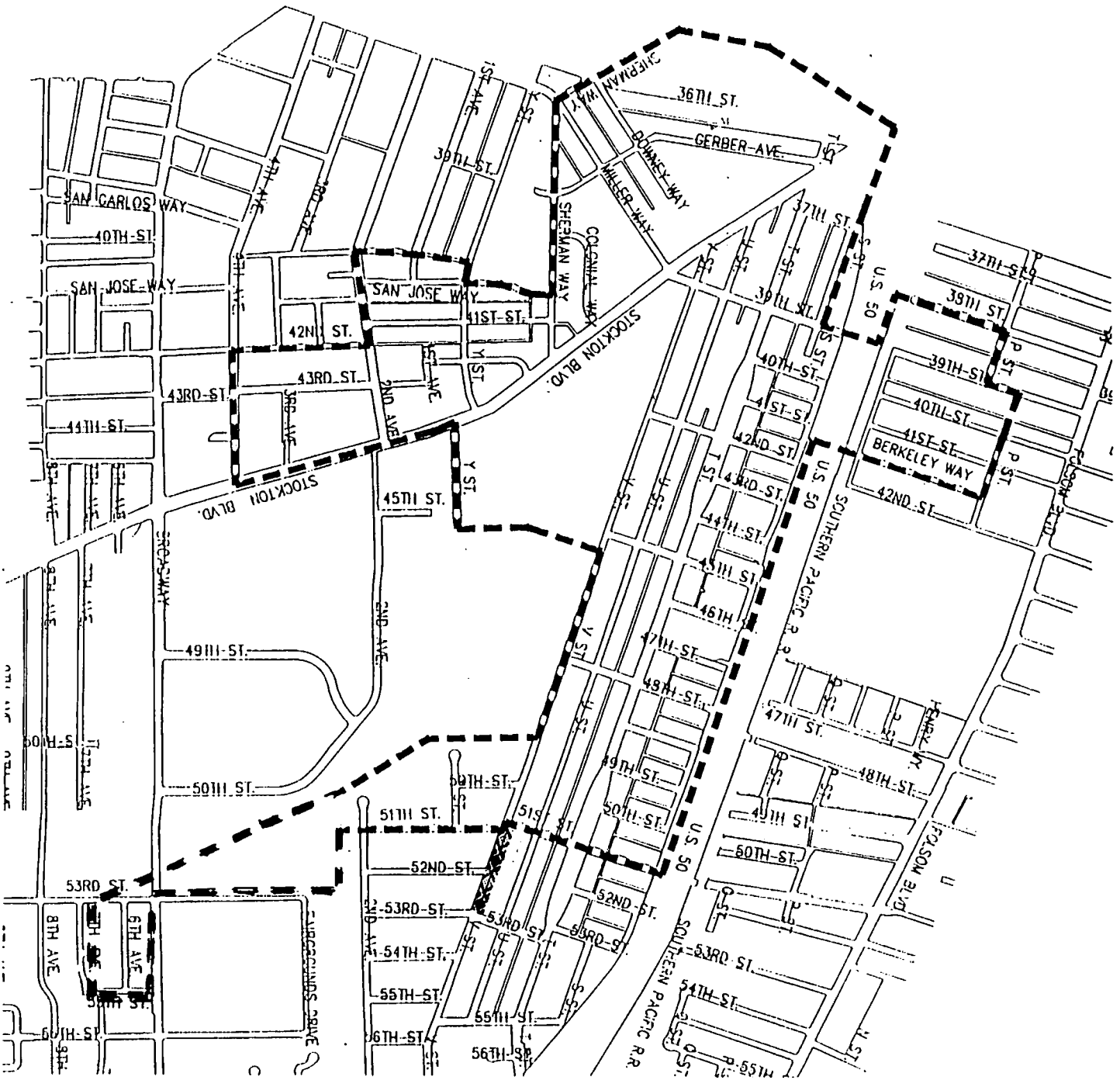

THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO THAT:

Parking shall be prohibited except with "B" permit from 8 am to 6 pm except Saturdays, Sundays, and Holidays on the following street:

- V Street, both side, from 51st to 52nd Streets.
