MARCH 16, 1950

MUNICIPAL OFF-STREET VEHICULAR PARKING PLACES

The Honorable City Council met in Special Session on this date at hour of 9:05 o'clock A. M.

Roll call was answered by the following members of the City Council:

Councilmen Bahnfleth, Cooledge, Geisreiter, Hendren, Macaulay, Nielsen, Sayre, Seymour, Wood. Others present : City Manager Cavanaugh, City Engineer Klaus, City Attorney Glenn, Traffic Engineer Faustman, City Planning Engineer Hall, Steven W. Downey, Legal Counsel, Gerald R. Johnson, Attorney representing Plaza Garage Corporation, et al.

Copy of the call issued by the Mayor and City Clerk was ordered filed.

The Mayor stated purpose of the meeting to be "Receiving and considering report of Steven W. Downey, Special Legal Counsel and City Attorney Glenn in matter of Municipal Off-Street Vehicular Parking Places".

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Mayor Geisreiter then called upon Attorney Downey who addressed the Council announcing that the Mayor and Senator Desmond had been successful in having the Governor call a Special Session for the purpose of passing a bill to submit Constitutional Amendment No. 33 to the Electorate in connection with State Primary Election June 6, 1950, instead of the General Election in November when there might be other conflicting measures on the ballot; further stating that said amendment in authorizing the use of parking meter funds to secure revenue bonds and for the issuing of said bonds on public vehicular projects, would undoubtedly carry and thereby eliminate practically all of the legal technicalities otherwise involved.

City Manager Cavanaugh reported there were two other constitutional amendments to be submitted on the same ballot but that the same would not jeopardize the passage of off-street parking amendment.

Mayor Geisreiter reported that the League of California Cities had requested Governor Warren to submit the proposal and that the League, in sponsoring and writing the explanation of the amendment to the voters, would also lead in a state-wide campaign to secure its approval by the Electorate and that there would be no formal negative argument proposed to the voters.

Attorney Downey stated that the passage of the amendment would practically remove all legal obstacles and render his report, which had heretofore been prepared and to have been rendered two weeks previously, of no consequences and value, assuming that the voters' approval thereof would be given, and upon that premise, indicated that the remaining action for the Council to take during the interim pending the passage of the amendment would be to the following effect: (1) Determine specifically the properties to be acquired; (2) Order title reports started; (3) Employ an expert to secure options of 90 days or more; (4) Go ahead just as soon as the necessary steps have been taken for the issuance of the bonds; (5) Thereafter subsequent properties could be acquired by separate bond issues; (6) If it is found there cannot be assembled an economic project, then file condemnation cases; further recommending that as much work as possible be completed before date of the election, emphasizing that securing of options and title reports require considerable time and in the event many

of the property owners should submit to condemnation, extended delays could possibly occur.

In reply to questions of members of the City Council, Attorney Downey informed the City Council that there must be sufficient available funds to purchase properties after the rendering of condemnation decisions; various angles and phases of the entire subject were then discussed at length and upon recommendation of the attorneys and City Manager, Councilman Wood moved that authority be granted the City Manager to proceed with securing of title reports on two pieces of property, namely block H and I, 10th and 11th Streets (except new structure thereon) and block 6th and 7th Streets, between L and Capitol Avenue, respectively; seconded by Councilman Seymour, further discussed and motion was unanimously carried by the following vote:

The question of the amount allocated from the parking meter fund was discussed and City Manager Cavanaugh pointed out that Section No. 274 of the Charter Amendment stipulates a maximum of \$50,000 per annum and that there was \$70,000 already accumulated in said Special Fund, to date.

After still further consideration and upon recommendation of the legal counsel, Councilman Hendren moved that it be expressed as a policy of the City Council that before proceeding to acquire any property for municipal off-street vehicular parking projects to first negotiate for the acquirement thereof at appraised value in advance of condemnation proceedings; seconded by Councilwoman Cooledge and after further discussion, motion was unanimously carried as follows:
