RESOLUTION APPROPRIATING \$76,000 FOR REPAIRS OF  
BRIDGE EMBANKMENTS AT VARIOUS LOCATIONS (JN:9873)

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

1. Funds are needed for the repairs of bridge embankments at Sutterville Road and U.P.R.R.; Arden Way and S.P.R.R.; El Camino Avenue and S.P.R.R.; Marconi Avenue and S.P.R.R.
2. The Capital Improvement Program is hereby amended by appropriating \$76,000 to the Bridge Embankment Restoration Project at Various Locations (JN:9873) as follows:
  - a. \$12,000 from the Capital Grant Public Fund, (Fund 248).
  - b. \$64,000 from the Gas Tax Contingency Reserve Fund (Fund 203-710-7012-4999).
3. The Capital Grant Public Fund (Fund 248) balance is increased by \$12,000 to account for revenues to be received from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

SUBJECT: Bridge Embankment Repairs At Various Locations, (JN:9873) -  
Project Approval And Fund Appropriation.

SUMMARY

Plans and specifications for bridge embankment repairs for Sutterville Road at U.P.R.R., Arden Way at S.P.R.R., El Camino Avenue at S.P.R.R. and Marconi Avenue at S.P.R.R. are being finalized. Funding is required and project approval is recommended.

BACKGROUND

The severe storms experienced during the winter of 1985-86 caused bridge embankment slip-outs at these bridges. This project will provide for restoration of the embankments to their original condition. If these slip-outs are not repaired, further erosion of the embankment will occur and eventually undermine roads and sidewalks.

These bridges, except for the Sutterville Road Overhead, were constructed in the summer of 1984 as part of the Light Rail project.

Since damage was caused by the storms, this project is eligible for partial reimbursement from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

Formal CIP approval was delayed until now to allow more accurate project costs and to allow inspection of embankments by FEMA Inspectors.

FINANCIAL

This project is not currently funded by the City. The estimated total project cost including all planning, design and construction is \$76,000. FEMA's minimum contribution to the total project cost is \$12,000 which is based upon Damage Survey Report estimates prepared by FEMA inspectors. A Grant-In-Lieu has been submitted to FEMA, asking them to re-evaluate their estimate and to appropriate more funds for restoration of the embankments. The exact amount of additional funds to be received (if any) has not been determined at this time.

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In general, FEMA's contribution to the project is affected only if bids come in lower than their estimates. In that case, they will contribute based on the amount of the low bid. On the other hand, if bids come in higher than their estimates, they will contribute based on their estimated amount.


It is recommended that the funding be provided as follows:

1. \$12,000 from the Capital Grant Public Fund (Fund #248), which would be reimbursed once FEMA funds are received.
2. \$64,000 from the Gas Tax Contingency Reserve.


RECOMMENDATION
