SUBJECT: CHANGES TO THE APPROVED 2002-07 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT

PROGRAM BUDGET

LOCATION AND COUNCIL DISTRICT: Citywide

RECOMMENDATION: This report recommends that the City Council adopt the attached resolution implementing the following changes to the approved 2002-2007 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) budget:

- Appropriate and reprogram funds from the Focus Area Contingency Program, Measure A, Community Development Block Grants (CDBG) and Economic Development Utilities funding for the Stockton Boulevard. Beautification Project Phase III Design (PN: TY51); and
- Reprogram a portion of Focus Area Contingency funding for the 63rd Street & Folsom Boulevard Signal Light from FY 2002/03 to FY 2003/04 (PN: TU42).

SUMMARY:

During this year's budget workshops, City Council directed staff to report back on the funding for two projects, Stockton Boulevard Beautification Phase III and 63rd Street & Folsom Boulevard traffic signal. Staff from Economic Development, Public Works, Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Agency (SHRA), Planning, and Budget has worked together to develop a funding strategy that is consistent with City Council direction and meets existing priority project commitments.

COMMITTEE/COMMISSION ACTION: None

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

In 1999, the Focus Area Contingency Program was established to provide transportation funds to leverage other infrastructure investments for redevelopment, infill, and economic development projects. The Public Works Department sets aside \$750,000 annually of Measure A funds to be used by Economic Development, SHRA, and Planning to facilitate their priority economic development and in-fill projects. The City and SHRA worked together to program the annual allocation of funds, which is generally allotted in the following manner:

McClellan Heights Infrastructure (PN: TU38)	\$200,000
SHRA (PN: TU31)	183,000
Economic Development (PN: TU39)	183,000
In-fill Development (PN: TU34)	184,000

Stockton Boulevard Beautification Project Phase III (PN: TY51)

City Council directed staff to look for additional funding to fully fund the design work for the third and final phase of the project. Staff is recommending that \$450,000, from a variety of fund sources, be programmed for the project. The funding details are provided in the financial considerations section of this report. The design work is expected to begin in spring 2003. Currently there is no funding to construct the project.

63rd Street & Folsom Boulevard Signal Light (PN: TU42)

Economic Development selected this project to be funded with Focus Area Contingency funds in FY 2002/03. Staff is working on a project at the corner of 65th and Folsom which may require a traffic signal. An operations study will be conducted to determine if a signal is viable in this location. If it is not, Economic Development will reprogram the funds following the Focus Area Contingency Program guidelines. Staff is recommending that \$40,000 remain in this CIP for design, if the signal location is viable. The balance of \$150,000 would be funded from next year's Focus Area Contingency funds. The project cost is expected to be \$190,000, rather than \$160,000 originally programmed in the FY 2002/03 CIP.

Woodruff Hotel/Guild Theater Alley Improvements (PN: TU43)

The Woodruff Hotel/Guild Theater is a redevelopment project at 35th and Broadway. Cityrequired public improvements resulted in a \$40,000 financing gap for the developer. Focus Area Contingency Program funds have already been administratively programmed to cover the cost of repairing the adjacent alley, curbs, gutters and sidewalks and providing ADA compliant curb ramps. Construction is in progress and is scheduled to be completed by February 2003.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

City Council approved the following programming for Focus Area Contingency funds within the approved 2002-2007 Transportation CIP Budget:

In Fiscal Year 2002/03:

- \$ 57,000 to be programmed by Economic Development (PN: TU39)
- \$160,000 for the 63rd Street & Folsom Blvd. Signal Light (PN: TU42)
- \$533,000 to fund the gap in the Del Paso Nuevo Project (PN: TU41) \$750,000

In Fiscal Year 2003/04 the following programming was anticipated:

- \$345,500 for Alta Arden/Ethan Way Intersection Improvements (PN: SMAA)
- \$200,000 for the McClellan Heights Infrastructure Project (PN: TU38)
- \$183,000 to be programmed by SHRA (PN: TU31)
- \$ 21,500 to be programmed by Economic Development (PN: TU34) \$750,000

The **recommended reprogramming** of Focus Area Contingency funds is shown below with proposed changes shown in **bold** type.

In Fiscal Year 2002/03:

- \$177,000 for the Stockton Boulevard Beautification Project Phase III (PN: TY51)
- \$ 40,000 for the Woodruff Hotel/Guild Theater Alley Improvements (PN: TU43)
- \$ 40,000 for the 63rd Street & Folsom Boulevard Signal (PN: TU42)
- \$533,000 to fund the gap in the Del Paso Nuevo Project (PN: TU41)
 \$790,000 (Note: \$40,000 of this funding is from the 2003/04 allocation)

In Fiscal Year 2003/04 the following programming will be recommended:

- \$345,500 for Alta Arden/Ethan Way Intersection Improvements (PN: SMAA)
- \$200,000 for the McClellan Heights Infrastructure Project (PN: TU38)
- \$150,000 for the 63rd Street & and Folsom Boulevard Signal (PN: TU42)
- \$ 14,500 to be programmed by Economic Development (PN: TU34) \$710,000

Stockton Boulevard Beautification Project Phase III Design (PN: TY51)

The total project cost is \$450,000, with both existing and new fund sources listed below:
