The Honorable City Council met in Regular Session on this date at 8.30 o'clock P. M., Mayor Elkus presiding and Roll Call being answered by following members of City Council:

The Minutes of Regular Meeting of November 1st, and Minutes of Regular Meeting of November 8th, 1923 were read and approved.
