

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION NO. 2500

WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the City Council of the City of Sacramento that the public interest and convenience require that the work and improvement hereinafter described should be done;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Sacramento does hereby resolve and declare that it is the intention of said City Council to order the following street work to be done, to-wit:

To close, vacate and abandon that portion of the alley in the block bounded by 19th and 20th, "R" and "S" Streets, which lies east of a line drawn parallel to the westerly line of 20th Street, measured 80 feet distant therefrom westerly at right angles, in the City of Sacramento; reserving, however, the right of entry to repair, maintain and construct sewer, water and gas pipe and aerial or underground power, telephone and other communication facilities now in place in said alley or which from time to time may be placed therein. All proceedings in connection with the aforesaid closing are to be taken subject to such reservations and exceptions.

And said City Council does hereby determine and declare that said proposed work and improvement is of more than local or ordinary public benefit, and will affect and benefit the lands and district hereinafter described, and which said district is hereby declared to be the district affected and benefited by said work and improvement, and that, therefore, the entire damages, costs and expenses of said work and improvement shall be, and are, hereby made chargeable against, and shall be assessable upon, said lands and district, which district is within the City of Sacramento, County of Sacramento, State of California.

The exterior boundaries of the lands affected and benefited by said work and improvement are particularly described as follows, to-wit:

On the north by "R" Street; on the south by "S" Street; on the east by 20th Street; and on the west by a line drawn parallel to the


westerly line of 20th Street and 80 feet distant therefrom, measured at right angles.

And the City Council does hereby elect to proceed to do said work under the provisions of Division 9, Part 3, Streets and Highways Code, the "Street Vacation Act of 1941," being an act of the legislature of the State of California, approved May 13, 1941.


Notice is hereby given that all persons interested in or objecting to the proposed vacation may appear before the City Council of the City of Sacramento, in the Council Chamber, located in the City Hall on "I" Street between 9th and 10th Streets, in said City, on February 4, 1944, and be heard in the matter.

The "Sacramento Union" is hereby designated as the daily newspaper published and circulated in said City in which this resolution shall be published; and notices of the passage of this resolution shall be posted in accordance with law.
