Mr. Tom Long, Chief of Nuisance Abatement, reported that the enforcement of Section 25.150 relating to parking of vehicles on private property has been successful. There have been 574 citations issued to vehicles violating Section 25.150.

Chair Robie stated that the major problem of diesel trucks parking in residential areas still exists very heavily. She still is seeing diesel trucks parked, especially on weekends. Chair Robie is to prepare a list of lots with parked diesel trucks for investigation by Nuisance Abatement.
