

Sacramento, California.  
April 25, 1929.

The Civil Service Board of the City of Sacramento met in special session on the above date at 7:45 o'clock P.M. in their office, Room 106 City Hall, President Chenu presiding.

PRESENT: Commissioners Mason, Weisman, and Chenu.  
ABSENT : None.

The minutes of the special meetings of April 8, 9, adjourned meeting of April 18th, and special meeting of April 22nd were read and approved as read.

Verne Lewis, Police Officer, appeared before the Board relative to his request for correction of his service record. The Chairman explained that his Civil Service rights dated from September 14, 1918, continuously to the present time, except for a break of fifteen days from June 15, 1919, until July 1, 1919, which period he was not in the employ of the city. Upon motion by Commissioner Mason, seconded by Commissioner Weisman and unanimously carried, it was the sense of the Board that this explanation should be made a matter of record.

Communication was received from H. E. Jones, Foreman of the Garbage Department, relative to the service record of E. Young, Garbageman in his employ. Mr. Jones explained that he had erroneously reported E. Young as resigned September 26, 1927, when in reality he should have reported him on leave of absence. In view of this statement of fact Mr. Jones requested the Board to classify Young as Garbageman without the necessity for examination. Upon motion by Commissioner Mason, seconded by Commissioner Weisman, and unanimously carried, the Board instructed the Secretary to secure from both Mr. Jones and E. Young affidavits substantiating the truth of these facts.

Communication was received from B. C. Clark, City Engineer, asking for the reclassification of the Permanent Street Improvement Clerk (Rose

Silveira) from Junior Clerk to either Stenographer or Senior Clerk. The request met with the approval of the Board, and upon motion by Commissioner Weisman, seconded by Commissioner Mason, and unanimously carried, the Secretary was instructed to reclassify Rose Silveira from Junior Clerk to Stenographer.

Louis Laughlin again appeared before the Board in regard to his request for review of his examination papers for electrical operator. Inasmuch as the Board did not have the papers available for review at this time, Mr. Laughlin's case was made a special order of business for the next meeting. Upon motion by Commissioner Weisman, seconded by Commissioner Mason, and unanimously carried, the Board instructed the Secretary to invite Mr. Carl M. Hoskinson to be present at this meeting in this connection.

The secretary reported that he had been advised that A. G. Crell, next man on the eligible list for Laborer, had removed from the city. The Board instructed the Secretary to mail three certifications for employment to Mr. Crell and to drop his name from the eligible list after same were ignored. In event of his employment, the Secretary was instructed to have this man comply with the request of the Board for an explanation of his communication addressed to the City Council under date of February 8, 1929, relative to exservice men's preference before certifying him to any position.

John Worthen, candidate in the recent examination for Garbageman, was granted exservice man's preference on presentation of evidence of his army service other than his honorable discharge. Mr. Worthen presented to the Board a copy of notes which he had made with the California National Bank in securing loans on his adjusted compensation certificate. It was the sense of the Board that this was sufficient evidence on which to grant this man exservice men's preference.

The Board then proceeded to review the examination papers for Oiler and Deputy Assessor. Envelopes were opened and identification established for candidates taking examination for Oilers. Envelopes were opened and identification established for candidates taking the examination for Deputy Assessor. May 3, 1929, at the hour of 6:30 o'clock P.M. was set for the Personal Fitness Test for Deputy Assessor, Oiler, and Watchman.

The Board then established the following weighted averages:

- Deputy Assessor--the total weighted score, plus 63, divided by four equals the percent.
- Personal Fitness Test--equals the percentage of proficiency times one.
- Final Percent--equals total of the above divided by two.

- Oilers, Elevator Operators, and Garbagemens examination--total weighted score times one equals the percent.
- Personal Fitness Test--equals the percentage of proficiency times one.
- Final Percent--equals the total of the above divided by two.

Upon motion by Commissioner Mason, seconded by Commissioner Weisman, and unanimously carried, eligible list for the following classifications were established, effective May 1, 1929, and to be posted April 26, 1929:
