

Sacramento, California,

May 25, 1931.

The Civil Service Board of the City of Sacramento met in special session on the above date at 7:00 o'clock P. M. in the office of the Board, Room 106 City Hall, President Chenu presiding.

PRESENT: Commissioners Maloney and Chenu.
ABSENT : Commissioner Weisman.

The minutes of the previous meeting of April 27, 1931, were read and approved as read.

The classification questionnaires recently distributed to the employees were reviewed by the Board.

The question of revision of the Civil Service Rules was considered by the Board and action was deferred.

A communication was received from W. L. Hall, requesting his reinstatement to the Civil Service list. The Board found that Mr. Hall's leave had exceeded the time limit prescribed in the Civil Service regulations. Commissioner Maloney moved that the request of Mr. Hall for reinstatement be denied and that the Secretary be instructed to advise Mr. Hall of the action of the Board. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Chenu. The vote was as follows:

AYES: Commissioners Maloney and Chenu.
NOES: None. ABSENT: Commissioner Weisman.

The names of the following eligibles appearing on the Laborer's eligible list were presented to the Board with the information that these eligibles had been duly certified and that no response had been obtained within the time limit set:

H. R. Coval, L. P. Gilhaus, Howard Fassett, A. Uzelac,

Harvey Stanley, and Samuel Laumetto.

Commissioner Maloney moved that the names of the above eligibles be removed from the Laborer's eligible list. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Chenu. The vote was as follows:

AYES: Commissioners Maloney and Chenu.
NOES: None. ABSENT: Commissioner Weisman.

The Board gave consideration to that part of Rule 4 recently amended and its effect on eligible lists already established. Action was deferred until a full Board was present.

Adjournment was taken at 9:00 o'clock P. M. to meet again, Tuesday, May 26th at 6:00 o'clock P. M.
