WASTE MANAGEMENT BOARD FOR 2000/2003 USED OIL  
RECYCLING BLOCK GRANT - 6<sup>TH</sup> CYCLE

**RECOMMENDATION:**

This report recommends that the City Council adopt a resolution authorizing submittal of a grant application to the California Integrated Waste Management Board for a Used Oil Recycling Block Grant to promote used oil recycling.

**SUMMARY:**

A grant application will be submitted to the California Integrated Waste Management Board on April 6, 2000. The proposed grant project would allow the City of Sacramento to act as the lead agency and grant administrator in a regional effort aimed at promoting used oil and filter recycling and to continue covering the cost of used oil collection. This report recommends City Council's approval of a resolution authorizing application for the 2000/2003 Used Oil Recycling Block Grant - 6<sup>th</sup> Cycle and execution of a standard agreement with the State.

**COMMITTEE/COMMISSION ACTION:** None.

**BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

Solid Waste staff estimates collecting 66,000 gallons of used oil in 1999 through the residential Curbside Recycling program. City staff is currently utilizing grant funding to collect and promote used oil recycling throughout the City in compliance with State regulations and waste diversion mandates. Receipt of additional grant funding will allow the City of Sacramento to continue to promote used oil and filter recycling and to reimburse the City for ongoing program cost associated with this program. The City as the lead agency in a regional grant with the Cities of Citrus Heights, Galt, and Isleton will coordinate with these Cities for promotion of used oil recycling in their jurisdictions.

The attached resolution for City Council adoption names the Solid Waste Manager and Solid Waste Planning Superintendent as the City's authorized representative. This action is taken because the authorized representative is the only person whose signature will be recognized by the California Integrated Waste Management Board. Using the Solid Waste Manager and the Solid Waste Planning Superintendent as the City's authorized representative will greatly facilitate administration of the grant because they are the City's staff who will work with Waste Board staff on a routine basis as the author of periodic billings, monthly progress reports, etc.

**FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:**

Grant funding for the 2000/2003 Used Oil Recycling Block Grant – 6<sup>th</sup> Cycle is for a three-year grant cycle. It is anticipated that grant funding will exceed \$120,000 per year. This funding will reimburse the City for the estimated cost of promoting and participating in this program.

**ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS:**

The grant project is not a project under CEQA. There is no possibility that the activity may have a significant effect on the environment. Therefore, this item is exempt from CEQA guidelines under §15061(b)(3).

**POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:**

The promotion of used oil and filter recycling is consistent with City of Sacramento waste diversion programs and goals. A comprehensive used oil and filter-recycling program increases the effectiveness of current recycling efforts and is in compliance with State and City waste reduction mandates and goals.


Policy considerations related to the submittal of this grant application are enumerated below:

- The utilization of State grant funding to pay for used oil recycling is also consistent with Council policy to increase the scope of our services without impacting the City rate payer.
- The City of Sacramento is also subject to standards imposed by the Federal government related to the National Pollution Discharge Elimination System. Reducing the illegal discharge of used oil by means of increasing used oil recycling will facilitate the City's compliance with this federal mandate.

**ESBD CONSIDERATIONS:**

The City will conform to all ESBD procurement policies and practices.



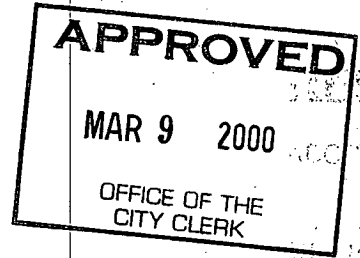

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A GRANT APPLICATION TO THE CALIFORNIA INTEGRATED WASTE MANAGEMENT BOARD FOR A 2000/2003 USED OIL RECYCLING BLOCK GRANT - 6<sup>TH</sup> CYCLE**

The Solid Waste Manager and Solid Waste Planning Superintendent of the City of Sacramento are hereby authorized and empowered to execute in the name of the City of Sacramento, if authorized by such other agencies, on behalf of the cities of Citrus Heights, Galt, and Isleton, all necessary applications, contracts, agreements, amendments, payment requests, progress reports, and final reports for the purposes of securing said grant funds and to implement and carry out the purposes specified in the grant application.
