

Sacramento, California,

November 4, 1931.

The Civil Service Board of the City of Sacramento met in special session on the above date at six o'clock P. M. in the office of the Board, Room 106 City Hall, President Chenu presiding.

PRESENT: Commissioners Maloney, Weisman, and Chenu.
ABSENT : None.

Mr. J. A. Boyd, a candidate in the examination for Laborer and claiming preference under Section 45 of the City Charter, left his discharge papers with the Board and after a review of these papers it was properly moved by Commissioner Weisman, seconded by Commissioner Maloney, and unanimously carried, that his discharge was in order and that he be granted preference under this section.

Commissioner Maloney introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption:

RESOLVED, that every applicant claiming preference under Section 45 of the City Charter be required to furnish an honorable discharge, or the equivalent thereof, at the time the applicant appears at the personal fitness test or within thirty days after any examination has been completed by the Board; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that unless this provision is complied with, preference will not be allowed.


The motion to adopt the resolution was seconded by Commissioner Weisman. The vote was as follows:

AYES: Commissioners Maloney, Weisman, and Chenu.
NOES: None. ABSENT: None.

It was properly moved by Commissioner Maloney and seconded

by Commissioner Weisman and unanimously carried that the Secretary be instructed to secure an opinion from the City Attorney upon the request of Mr. James Darwin, an employee in the Police Department, to have the Board consider his two month's temporary appointment as a part of his six month's probationary period.

No further business appearing before the Board, they stood adjourned at seven-thirty o'clock P. M. to meet again at the call of the Chair.
