**SUBJECT: AUTHORIZATION TO APPLY TO THE CALIFORNIA
INTEGRATED WASTE MANAGEMENT BOARD FOR WASTE
TIRE ENFORCEMENT GRANT.**

LOCATION AND COUNCIL DISTRICT: Citywide

RECOMMENDATION:

This report recommends that the City Council adopt a resolution authorizing submittal of a grant application to the California Integrated Waste Management Board for waste tire enforcement activities.

SUMMARY:

A grant application was submitted to the California Integrated Waste Management Board on February 20, 1998. The grant proposal requests funding for the inspection and compliance of waste tire facilities throughout the City and a thorough survey of all retail tire shops and auto dismantlers operating in the City. This report recommends City Council's approval of a resolution authorizing application for the tire enforcement grant and execution of an agreement with the State to perform the work contained within the attached grant proposal.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Solid Waste staff collects approximately more than 10,000 tires that are illegally dumped in the public right-of-way on an annual basis. Utilizing our Department of Public Works Neighborhood Police Officers and Solid Waste Utility Services Inspectors, several small retail shops were targeted for enforcement. City personnel visited the tire shops to ascertain if registered tire haulers were being utilized. City staff requested to see manifest documents as evidence of compliance. It was our experience that when our staff returned to the same tire facilities, the retailers showed marked improvement in being able to produce current manifest documents to support regulatory compliance. Many of the activities eligible for funding under the grant will emulate the above process.

The attached grant application was prepared in strict conformance to the grant guidelines. This grant application includes a request for funding to reimburse City staff for expenses related to various waste tire enforcement activities. Grant guidelines require submittal of the required City Council resolution by March 31, 1998.

The attached resolution for City Council adoption names the Solid Waste Planning Superintendent as the City's authorized representative. This action is taken because the authorized representative is the only person whose signature will be recognized by the California Integrated Waste Management Board. Using the Solid Waste Planning Superintendent as the City's authorized representative will greatly facilitate administration of the grant because he is the City's staff person who will work with Waste Board staff on a routine basis as the author of periodic billings, monthly progress reports, etc.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

Grant funding has been requested in the amount of \$66,350. This funding will reimburse the City for labor expenses incurred in the performance of the grant project. Funding has been requested for specified activities in relation to the positions identified below:

Solid Waste Utility Services Inspectors
Department of Public Works Neighborhood Police Officers
Neighborhood Services Code Enforcement Officers
City Building and Fire Inspectors
Sacramento County Deputy Sheriff

The grant application includes a request for funding in the amount of \$5,000 for waste tire enforcement activities by the Deputy Sheriff currently assigned to the Sacramento County Waste Management and Recycling Division. Grant funded waste tire enforcement activities for the Deputy Sheriff will primarily focus on waste tire facilities operating in close proximity to the City limit borders. Facilities targeted for enforcement are those facilities most likely to contribute to illegal dumping of tires within the City.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The grant project is not a project under CEQA. It can also be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity may have a significant effect on the environment. Therefore, this item is exempt from CEQA guidelines under §15061(b)(3).


POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:

Waste tire enforcement is consistent with the City Council priority of neighborhood revitalization. The grant project is also consistent with City Council's direction to the Solid Waste Division in response to a report on illegal dumping in November 1997. The City Council directed Solid Waste Division staff to coordinate a task force to combat illegal dumping.

MBE/WBE:


M/WBE considerations are not applicable since no goods or services are being purchased. The grant application is limited to a request for funding personnel expenses.


