

Resolution of Intention No. 2106

Pursuant to the authority of an Act of the Legislature of the State of California, known as the "Improvement Act of 1911," approved April 7th, 1911, and the several Acts amendatory thereof.

It is hereby resolved that it is the intention of the City Council of the City of Sacramento to order the following street work to be done, to-wit:

The improvement of the following in the City of Sacramento:

"D" Street, from the easterly line of 35th Street to the westerly line of 36th Street; by removing and disposing of all surplus and refuse material; constructing concrete curb and gutter and concrete sidewalk; placing cast iron gutter drains and connecting same to sewer system with vitrified ironstone sewer pipe; constructing vitrified ironstone pipe sewer; constructing concrete manholes complete with cast iron curbs and covers; placing street monuments; grading; and constructing an asphaltic concrete pavement with a seal coat; and installing a street lighting system complete;

Right-of-way, owned by the City of Sacramento, between "O" and "D" Streets, from the easterly line of 35th Street to the center line of 36th Street; right-of-way, owned by the City of Sacramento, along the rear of the lots facing "D" Street on the South, from the easterly line of 35th Street to a point 40 feet westerly from the westerly line of 36th Street; and right-of-way, owned by the City of Sacramento, between Lots 24 and 25 of "McKinley Terrace" (as the same is shown on the official map thereof filed in the office of the County Recorder of the County of Sacramento, State of California) from the northerly line of "D" Street to the northerly line of said lots; by removing and disposing of all surplus and refuse material; constructing vitrified ironstone pipe sewer; and constructing concrete manholes complete with cast iron curbs and covers;

That certain street, commonly known as "O" Street, the same being an extension of "C" Street, from the center line of 33d Street to a point 2,250 feet easterly therefrom; by removing and disposing of all surplus and refuse material; constructing concrete curb and gutter; placing cast iron gutter drains and connecting same to sewer system with vitrified ironstone sewer pipe; constructing vitrified ironstone pipe sewer; constructing concrete manhole complete with cast iron curb and cover; reconstructing existing manhole by placing curb and cover to

grade; placing street monuments; constructing concrete sidewalk; grading; constructing an asphaltic concrete pavement with a seal coat; and installing a street lighting system complete; and

The easterly side of 33d Street, from a point 190 feet north of the north line of "B" Street to a point 10 feet south of the south line of "C" Street; by removing and disposing of all surplus and refuse material; constructing concrete curb and gutter; grading; constructing an asphaltic concrete pavement with a seal coat; and installing a street lighting system complete (curb, gutter, grading and pavement to be constructed only on that portion of 33d Street lying between a point 10 feet north of "C" Street and a point 10 feet south of "C" Street).

All of said work shall be done in accordance with the detailed plans therefor adopted by the said City Council and now on file in the office of the City Engineer, and also in accordance with the "Standard Specifications for the Improvement of Streets and Alleys and for the Construction of Sewers", heretofore adopted by said City Council.

Manhole curbs and covers shall conform to Cut No. 1 of said Specifications.

Concrete curb and gutter shall conform to Cut No. 6 of said Specifications.

Five (5) inch asphaltic concrete pavement to be constructed on "D" Street, as specified in Section 22 of said Specifications.

All other asphaltic concrete pavement to be six (6) inches in thickness, and constructed as specified in Section 22 of said Specifications.

Cast iron gutter drains shall conform to Cut No. 7 of said Specifications.

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Street Lighting Systems shall be constructed in accordance with plans and specifications adopted for doing said work and now on file in the office of the City Engineer.

And whereas, in the opinion of said City Council said work is of more than local and ordinary public benefit, said Council hereby orders that the costs and expenses of said work and improvement shall be chargeable and charged upon a district of lands, which district is hereby declared to be the district benefited by said work and improvement and which is to be assessed to pay the costs and expenses thereof.

The exterior boundaries of said district and the extent of the territory included therein are shown upon the map of said district adopted and approved by the City Council on **July 1st, 1926**, which map is now on file in the office of the City Engineer and to which reference is hereby made for a particular description of the boundaries of said district and of the extent of the territory included therein;

Saving and excepting from the above bounded and described district the area of all public streets, alleys, ways, boulevards, courts and avenues included therein.

Notice is hereby given that serial bonds to represent unpaid assessments and bear interest at the rate of seven (7) per cent per annum will be issued hereunder in the manner provided by the "Improvement Bond Act of 1915," the last installment of which bonds shall mature nine (9) years from the second day of July next succeeding ten (10) months from their date.

All persons objecting to said work, or to the extent of said assessment district, are required to file their objections in writing in the office of the City Clerk of the City of Sacramento, as required by law, and notice is hereby given to all persons interested that on the **29th** day of **July**, 192**6**, at **8** o'clock p. m., in the Council Chamber of the City Council of the City of Sacramento, in the City Hall, on "I" Street, between 9th and 10th Streets, in said City, any and all persons having any objections to the proposed work and improvement may appear before said City Council and show cause why the proposed work and improvement shall not be carried out in accordance with this Resolution.

And the City Clerk is hereby directed to publish this Resolution twice in the **Sacramento Union**, a daily newspaper, as required by law.
