**RESOLUTION EXPRESSING CONCERN FOR
THE STATE EDUCATION BUDGET FOR 1987-88**

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Sacramento is concerned about the inadequate 1987-88 State Education Budget; and

WHEREAS, the budget proposes only 9.3% of new state funds for K-12 schools, while over the past four years the state's increase on an average was 40% of new revenues; and

WHEREAS, the Governor's budget proposal reflects an expenditure loss of \$29 per pupil in California schools; and

WHEREAS, during the first four years of the Governor's administration, California went from \$222 to \$46 below the national average of per pupil expenditures and if enacted, the budget would sink California once again to \$198 below the national average, which would negate most advances made in recent years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and members of the Council of the City of Sacramento, that we hereby petition the Legislature and Governor George Deukmejian to restore funding in order to adequately support public K-12 education in the 1987-88 school year; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution be conveyed to Governor George Deukejian and the California State Legislature.
