

RESOLUTION No. 312

Adopted by The Sacramento City Council on date of
August 12, 1938


WHEREAS, there is now before the government of the City of Sacramento a very vital problem with respect to the proper care and protection of the citizens and residents of this City, said problem pertaining to possible fire hazard that may exist in any City where steady growth has resulted in some over-crowding, and

WHEREAS, This City has by and through the operation of its agencies and departments exercised and enforced all existing laws and ordinances pertaining to the proper housing and fire prevention, and

WHEREAS, it now becomes evident that a survey of the existing laws and ordinances coupled with an examination of the housing facilities of this City is necessary to determine what additional precautions and measures should be adopted in the matter.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that a Committee consisting of three members of this council and two citizens who are not members of the council nor employees of the City be appointed for the purpose of carrying on and conducting such survey and examination as the existing circumstances warrant, that that group be urged and requested to present their findings and recommendations to this council and the City Manager.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon filing its final findings and recommendations said committee shall be discharged.
