SUMMARY

The Sacramento Police Department and Sacramento City Unified School District are co-applicants for an 18-month, \$450,000 Operation Revitalization grant from the State of California Office of Criminal Justice Planning (OCJP). The grant proposal includes a comprehensive, multi-disciplinary approach to combating violent crime, drug use and gang activity in the Colonial Village area. Two (2) new Neighborhood Police Officers (NPOs) will conduct crime suppression and community policing activities in the target area (see attached map).

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Office of Criminal Justice Planning has, for the third time in four years, released a Request For Proposals (RFP) to implement a community-based drug prevention, intervention, and suppression project known as "Operation Revitalization". The Police Department applied for and received funding for the Oak Park Revitalization Plan under the first RFP in July 1993. The Oak Park Revitalization Plan was one of five Operation Revitalization grants that were recognized by the Attorney General as most successful in California. In response to the 1996 RFP release, the Police Department applied for and received funding for an Operation Revitalization Plan for the Del Paso Heights area.

The **Colonial Village Revitalization Plan** is modeled after the Oak Park and Del Paso Heights efforts. Consistent with grant requirements, the Police Department and Hiram Johnson High School are co-applicants for this revitalization grant. Four major strategies for this revitalization grant include intensified crime suppression; Community Oriented Policing; prevention, intervention and treatment; and neighborhood reclamation and revitalization.

Implementation of the **Colonial Village Revitalization Plan** will begin with a heavy concentration of crime suppression in the target area. After the initial suppression efforts, community policing strategies will be employed to maintain the target area. While the law enforcement efforts continue, Hiram Johnson High School will introduce and/or expand existing programs to suppress the presence of drugs on campus while working with feeder elementary and junior high schools and with high risk youth in the area. These programs will provide students with recreation and after school programs, along with drug/alcohol identification and intervention training for teachers and parents. Counseling will be made available from public and private agencies.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

Total funding of **\$450,000** is available for an 18 month period from July 1, 1997 through December 31, 1998. If funding for the program is approved, preliminary budget calculations indicate the Police Department will receive approximately **\$350,000** of the grant award, and Hiram Johnson High School and other service providers will share approximately **\$100,000**. The total cost of the 2.0 FTE police officers (NPOs) and the 1.0 FTE Community Service Officer will be fully reimbursed from grant funding from OCJP. All grant funds will be administered through the Fiscal Section of the Police Department. There is no match required for this grant.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS

Ongoing administrative and maintenance activities, such as purchase of supplies, equipment or materials which are not made for purposes of a public works construction project, do not

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constitute a "project" and are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act. CEQA Guidelines, Sections 15061(b)(1), 15378(b)(3).

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

Application for grant funding is consistent with past practices. Acceptance of these funds will allow development of an innovative program while forging a strong partnership among the Police Department, Hiram Johnson High School, and the community. Acceptance of these funds will allow the Police Department to enhance the NPO efforts in Patrol Sector 3. Funding for this project is limited to 18 months. A long term funding source will have to be identified after the grant expires.



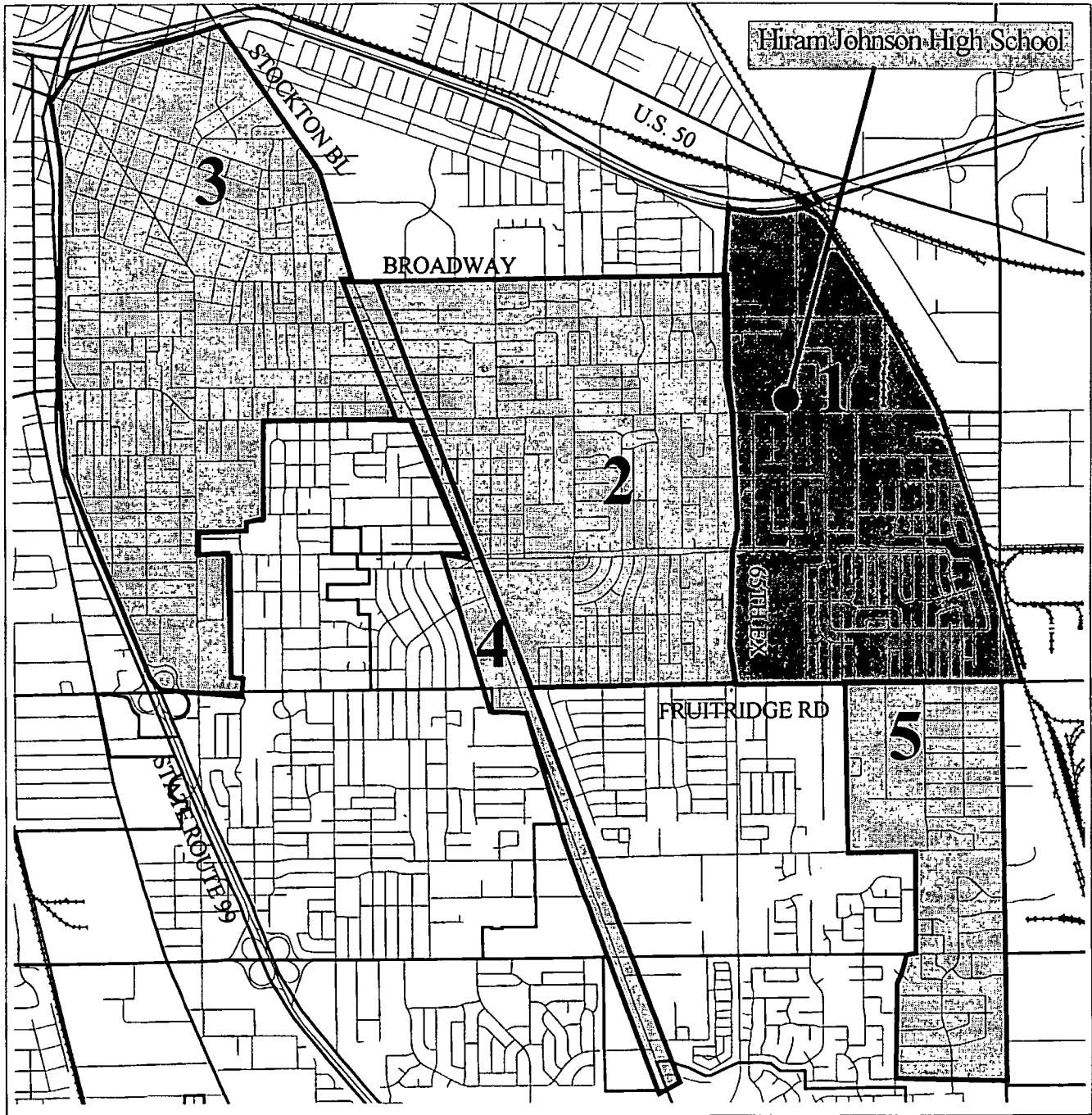

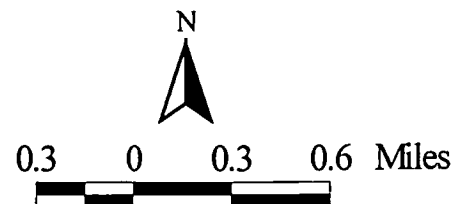
