**SUMMARY**

State law requires collection of a spay/neuter deposit fee whenever a dog or cat that has not been spayed or neutered is adopted from an animal shelter. Unclaimed deposits may be used only for those activities that encourage the spaying/neutering of cats and dogs. This report requests the transfer of \$17,000 from forfeited spay/neuter deposits to the Animal Control Division's operating budget for the design and printing of a public education brochure.

**BACKGROUND**

The attached report was heard by the Budget and Finance Committee on October 25, 1988. The Budget and Finance Committee approved the staff recommendation.

**FINANCIAL**

The cost of designing and printing a spay/neuter brochure is estimated to be \$17,000. Funding is available by transferring \$17,000 from the unclaimed Spay/Neuter Deposit Account (101-2460) to the Animal Control operating budget (101-310-3170-4213).



SUMMARY

State law requires collection of a spay/neuter deposit fee whenever a dog or cat that has not been spayed or neutered is adopted from an animal shelter. Unclaimed deposits may be used only for specified purposes. This report requests the transfer of \$ 17,000 from forfeited spay/neuter deposits to the Animal Control Division operating budget for the design and printing of a public education brochure.

BACKGROUND

Animal overpopulation is an issue of increasing concern. Thousands of unwanted kittens and puppies are born each year, and the majority of them must be euthanized. In an effort to reduce the stray dog and cat populations, state law requires that animal shelters collect a spay/neuter deposit each time an animal which is not already spayed or neutered is adopted. This fee is refunded to the pet owner when he or she produces a veterinarian's certificate verifying that the pet has been spayed or neutered. Many deposits are never recovered by the pet owner, however, and the money is segregated in a special account. Unclaimed funds in the spay/neuter deposit account may be used only for specified purposes, including "a public education program to prevent overpopulation of dogs and cats."

The Animal Control Division proposes using a portion of the City's unclaimed deposit revenue to produce an informational brochure emphasizing the importance of spaying and neutering pets and including additional information about adoption, licensing and rabies control. The brochure will be distributed to visitors to the animal shelter, made available at community meetings, and mailed to all City utility customers as a billing insert. The brochure will provide an important source of public information in an attractive, accessible format.

FINANCIAL

The total cost of designing and printing the brochure is estimated to be \$17,000. Funding is available by transferring \$17,000 from the unclaimed Spay/Neuter Deposit account (101-2460) to the Animal Control operating budget (101-310-3170-4213) to cover these costs. This transfer will not result in any net cost to the City.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Budget and Finance Committee approve the attached resolution which amends the Animal Control Division 1988-1989 operating budget by \$17,000 for a spay/neuter information brochure and forward the resolution to the full City Council for adoption.
