

## RESOLUTION No. 352

Adopted by The Sacramento City Council on date of  
May 9, 1947

WHEREAS, the City of Sacramento is the owner of approximately 45.25 acres of land situate south of Broadway and west of the Southern Pacific Right-of-Way, extending westerly to the Sacramento River, and commonly known as the "FREDERICK A. MILLER" property, which was given to the City for park purposes; and

WHEREAS, the City is desirous of having this property filled in in order to develop this property for the purposes for which it was intended; and

WHEREAS, the Corps of Engineers of the War Department of the United States of America for the Sacramento District are desirous of filling in this property with river sand,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL  
OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

That the Corps of Engineers of the War Department of the United States of America for the Sacramento District be, and they are hereby, authorized and empowered to enter upon the premises, clear the trees and river sand fill and on the top of the fill to be placed a stock pile of native soil to complete the surface coverage, to a depth of not less than one (1) foot, upon all that certain real property belonging to the City of Sacramento, lying south of Broadway and west of the Southern Pacific Railroad Right-of-Way to the Sacramento River, and commonly known as the "FREDERICK A. MILLER" property.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Manager is hereby authorized to complete the purposes of this resolution.
