

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION NO. 2481

WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the City Council of the City of Sacramento that the public interest and convenience require that the work and improvement hereinafter described should be done;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Sacramento does hereby resolve and declare that it is the intention of said City Council to order the following work and improvement to be done in said City of Sacramento, to-wit:

To close, vacate and abandon WEST LAND PARK DRIVE, from the southerly line of Bartley Drive produced easterly, to the southerly boundary of "Land Park Tract Unit No. 3" (as the same is shown on the official map or plat thereof filed in the office of the County Recorder of the County of Sacramento, State of California), produced easterly, in the City of Sacramento.

And said City Council does hereby determine and declare that said proposed work and improvement is of more than local or ordinary public benefit, and will affect and benefit the lands and district hereinafter described, which said district is hereby declared to be the district affected and benefited by said work and improvement; and that, therefore, the entire damages, costs and expenses of said work and improvement shall be, and they are, hereby made chargeable against, and shall be assessable upon, said lands and district, which district is within the City of Sacramento, County of Sacramento, State of California.

The exterior boundaries of the lands affected and benefited by said work and improvement are particularly described as follows, to-wit:

On the north by the southerly line of Bartley Drive; on the south by the southerly boundary of said "Land Park Tract Unit No. 3;" on the east by the westerly line of West Land Park Drive; and on the west by a line parallel to the westerly line of West Land Park Drive and 85 feet distant westerly therefrom, measured at right angles.

All of the said work and improvement shall be done in accordance with the provisions of a law of the State of California known as Division 5, Number 1, of the Streets and Highways Code, the "Street Opening Act of 1889."

The Superintendent of Streets is hereby directed to cause notices of the passage of this resolution to be printed and posted in accordance with law, and to cause a notice similar in substance to be published in the "Sacramento Union," a daily newspaper published and circulated in the said City of Sacramento, all as prescribed by law.
