SUBJECT: RECOMMENDATION TO INCREASE PARKING FEES FOR THE 1989-1990

FISCAL YEAR

SUMMARY

This is a recommendation to increase Parking On-Street and Off-Street parking fees pursuant to policy directive of the Budget and Finance Committee, that such fees be reviewed and increased annually.

BACKGROUND

In 1978, due to Proposition 13, the City implemented a graduated fee scale for off-street parking, whereby, the first three hours were 25¢ each, and the third hour and thereafter were 40¢ each (6 a.m. to 6 p.m.). This was to increase revenues to make offstreet parking a self-supporting enterprise fund, while fees from on-street parking meters were redirected to the general fund to compensate for the reduction in property tax revenues. From July 1978 until July 1988, the City's off-street parking facilities continued to charge 25¢ for each of the first three hours of Recommendations to increase the rate for each of the parking. first three hours were initially undertaken in 1985. Due to local business concerns, however, the Council opted for retaining the 25¢ rate for each of the first three hours and continuing increases for the fourth hour and thereafter, culminating in a fee scale of .25¢.25¢.25¢.100, etc. through 1987-1988. The low fee for the first three hours of parking increasingly became an incentive for downtown workers to park in the City garages for the hourly cash fee, exit every three hours, and re-enter in order to pay a bargain rate (\$2.25) for all day parking. Under this rate scale, over 70% of those parking on an hourly basis parked three hours or less.

In January of 1988, ten years later, the Downtown Parking Study was completed by Wilbur Smith & Associates. In addition to quantifying and analyzing Sacramento's Downtown parking conditions, this study provided a 15 year projection on the financial status of the City's parking fund. The study not only projected parking revenues, but also included the costs for new capital improvement lease payments to SHRA and inflationary cost index increases in operating costs. The need to increase off-street and on-street parking fees was illustrated in this report, showing forthcoming deficits as future capital improvements constructed.

The <u>Downtown Parking Study</u> was used as a working document by the Mayor's Downtown Transportation Task Force, which had been appointed by the City Council in 1987, to study and recommend a joint City/County/State Transportation and Parking strategy. The Task Force recommended interim parking fee increases in City parking facilities for the 1988-1989 fiscal year, until an economic study could be completed to analyze the impact on downtown retail business if the graduated parking rate scale were changed to increase the fee for the third hour of parking. The recommended interim rates were adopted by the City Council in July 1988 and are shown as "existing" rates in the tables on pages 3, 4 and 5 of this report.

In May 1989, the <u>Downtown Economic Study</u> draft final report was issued and distributed to the Downtown Transportation Task Force. The study concluded that although initial negative impacts to the Downtown economy could be expected with increasing the parking fee for the third hour to \$1.00 in City parking garages, the loss would be temporary, lasting from one to four months. Increased sales would occur thereafter as a direct result of increased availability of short term parking. The study also forecasts the additional positive impacts of a shift in single occupant vehicle (S.O.V.) commuters to carpools or other transportation alternatives (bus, lightrail, bicycling, and walking.) This could decrease peak hour downtown traffic congestion and create a positive impact on Sacramento's air quality. The fee increase would also offset lost revenues caused by vehicles circulating to evade the long term parking rate.

The <u>Downtown Economic Study</u> is being presented in more detail to the Budget and Finance Committee in a separate report.

A ten year projection of the financial status of the City's offstreet parking enterprise, shows that without recommended parking
fee increases, the City parking enterprise will experience large
deficits each year starting in the 1989-1990 fiscal year. The East
End Garage is the most immediate financial concern, since this
project is underway, with current, updated cost estimates
anticipated in a few months. Other future projects include a Civic
Center Garage, an expansion of the Community Center Garage, an
addition to the Old Sacramento Garage at 2nd & I Streets, and a new
garage to serve the Convention Center expansion project at 14th &
H Streets (Lot C). All of these projects will incur annual debt
services ranging in excess of \$6.0 million, or \$64 million in new
parking facility capital costs to serve the burgeoning growth and
development of the Downtown area.

Based on the foregoing considerations, proposed parking fee increases for the 1989-1990 fiscal year are as follows:





- (1) Between 6AM and 6PM Monday through Friday: \$.40 (Lots G, K, P, R), \$.45 (Lots A, B, E), \$.55 (Lot H) each hour for first two hours, \$1.00 for each hour thereafter. Between 6AM and 6PM Saturday and Sunday: \$.40 each hour for first three hours, \$1.00 for each hour thereafter. Between 6PM and 6AM: \$.40 each hour with a \$2.40 maximum.
