AFFIRMATIVE ACTION PROGRAM REVIEW - PLANNING & DEVELOPMENT AND LIBRARY DEPARTMENTS

Gary Little, Affirmative Action Officer, presented an overview of this item.

Mac Mailes, Director of Planning and Community Development, Bob Wall, Assistant Director and Marty VanDuyn, Planning Director answered questions of the Committee regarding the number of minorities and women employed within the Department and the methods used to focus on minority hiring.

Janet Larson, Deputy Library Director, addressed the Committee on the Library Department's minority statistics. Ms. Larson explained the procedures the Library Department is currently using to encourage minorities and males to apply for positions within the Department.

PROPOSAL TO CREATE AN AFFIRMATIVE ACTION ADVISORY COMMITTEE

1. They would recommend that the full Council adopt their recommendation to establish an Affirmative Action Advisory Committee.
2. The Advisory Committee would advise staff and the P. & P.E. Committee on recruitment and policy changes.
3. The Committee would be appointed by the Mayor with recommendations from the Council.
4. Staff will prepare a report back to Committee regarding composition of the Advisory Committee. Report should reflect that the Committee will be comprised of no less than five (5) members and no more than nine (9) members.

Richard Lucero, President of SPOA, addressed the Committee on this issue. He requested that Union representatives be considered as Committee members.

Ms. Mary Lozano also spoke on this item.
