

Sacramento, California,
June 14, 1928.

The Civil Service Board of the City of Sacramento met in special session on the above date at 7.15 o'clock P. M. in the office of the City Manager in the City Hall, President Mason presiding.

PRESENT: Commissioners Chenu, Mason, Weisman.
ABSENT: None.

City Manager H. C. Bottorff also was in attendance during the early part of the meeting by invitation.

Minutes of special meeting of May 29, 1928, were read and approved as read.

City Manager Bottorff announced that he had appointed A. O. Hoover, Deputy City Controller, to act in the capacity of Secretary of the Civil Service Board and Pension Board, effective June 5th, in compliance with the provisions of the Charter and resolution of the City Council.

Upon motion by Commissioner Weisman, seconded by Commissioner Chenu and unanimously carried, this action was confirmed and approved.

Commissioner Weisman addressed the Board in commendation of the services of R. C. Oakley, former Secretary of the Board.

City Manager Bottorff reported that the former Secretary would assist the newly appointed Secretary in the conduct of the Board's affairs until such time as the volume of work now pending has been completed.

The following resolutions adopted by the City Council were presented:

Resolution No. 54

RESOLVED that the City Manager be requested to appoint a deputy in the office of the City Controller to act as Secretary of the Civil Service Board.

Adopted May 31, 1928.

Resolution No. 55.

RESOLVED by the City Council that a vote of thanks be extended the Civil Service Board of the City of Sacramento for their efficient and faithful services to the City.

Adopted May 31, 1928.

Ordered filed.

Committee from the Federated Trades Council appeared before the Board requesting that the maximum entrance age limit for city employment be set aside. J. L. R. Marsh read and presented statement in opposition to 48-year maximum entrance age. W. J. Leflar and Robert L. Hatfield also addressed the Board in reference to this subject.

The President outlined to the committee the reasons this rule was established, principally for the protection of employees entering the service after the age of 50 in the matter of eligibility for retirement pensions.

After a lengthy discussion of the subject, wherein the committee disclaimed any primary interest in pension eligibility, the matter was taken under advisement by the Board.

Bert M. Miller, representing the Electrical Worker's Union, addressed the Board in support of application of apprentice in the Electrical Division for salary increase of \$6.50 to \$7 per day.

Robert L. Hatfield, representing the International Union of Steam and Operating Engineers, presented communication and addressed the Board in support of request for salary increase for Steam Engineers.

These requests were taken under advisement.

Bertill Nelson, watchman-caretaker at the Corporation Yard, addressed the Board in reference to salary increase.

The Secretary was instructed to secure and present to the Board a statement of facts surrounding the transfer of Mr. Nelson from the position of Elevatorman at the city wharf to watchman at the Corporation Yard.

List of existing classifications of municipal employees was presented and discussed by the Board.

Upon motion by Commissioner Chenu, seconded by Commissioner Weisman and unanimously carried, the Secretary was instructed to review the existing classifications, consolidate same as far as possible, and secure from the State Civil Service Commission the salary ranges in effect for classifications comparable with those of the City of Sacramento, and present this information at the next meeting of the Board.

Upon motion by Commissioner Chenu, seconded by Commissioner Weisman and unanimously carried, the action of the Civil Service Board of May 29, 1928, in establishing maximum entrance age limit of 48 for municipal employees was rescinded.
