

Environmental Considerations:

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA): This report concerns administrative activities that will not have a significant effect on the environment, and does not constitute a “project” as defined by the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) [CEQA Guidelines Sections 15061(b)(3); 15378(b)(2)].


Sustainability Considerations: Solid Waste collection service to State Parks will help the keep the City clean of municipal solid waste (MSW) and meet mandated MSW diversion requirements.


Commission/Committee Action: Not applicable.

Rationale for Recommendation: The City’s Solid Waste division of the Department of Utilities provides commercial refuse and recycling collection services throughout the City. Since 2006, State Parks has contracted with the City of Sacramento for solid waste collection services and has once again requested service by the City for FY2010/11.

Financial Considerations: No funding is requested with this item. State Parks will be billed by the Department of Utilities for solid waste collection services for an amount not to exceed \$36,477 per the Council approved FY2010/11 Solid Waste commercial rate sheet.

AGREEMENT WITH CALIFORNIA PARKS DEPARTMENT TO ALLOW THE CITY TO PROVIDE SOLID WASTE COLLECTION SERVICES

BACKGROUND

- A. The California Parks Department has requested City Solid Waste services provide solid waste collection services for FY2010/11.
- B. The California Parks Department will reimburse the City up to \$36,477 for the cost to provide service to the following locations: Sutter's Fort, the Southern Pacific Shops, Leland Stanford Mansion, Old Governor's Mansion, and the California State Railroad Museum.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The City Manager or designee is authorized to execute an agreement with the California Parks Department for the City to provide solid waste collection services for an annual amount to not exceed \$36,477.
