SUBJECT: 1998 Sacramento Cultural Arts Awards Program

LOCATION AND DISTRICT: The City and County of Sacramento. All Districts.

RECOMMENDATION: This report recommends the City Council:

- 1) Approve allocation of 1998 Sacramento Cultural Arts Awards program funds to 41 Non-profit organizations for a total of \$414,932; and
- 2) Approve allocation of 1998 Community Enhancement Grants to 6 Cultural Arts Award grantees for a total of \$11,000; and
- 3) Authorize an agreement between the City and County of Sacramento and the transfer of \$110,932 for Regranting purposes.

SUMMARY:

Regranting funds total \$495,000: \$180,000 from the City and \$315,000 from the County. Funds for organizations under the Cultural Arts Awards total \$415,000 and \$15,000 for the Community Enhancement Grants. Funds for individual artists total \$30,000 each in the New Works and Fellowships programs. Technical Assistance funds total \$5,000. Forty-nine applications were ranked by a peer review panel: 41 are recommended to receive Cultural Arts Awards, six are recommended for Community Enhancement Grants, and eight are recommended for Technical Assistance.

COMMISSION ACTION:

- Funding of 41 Cultural Arts Awards approved by the Commission at their meeting of February 18, 1998: Ayes 11; Noes 0; Absent 0; Abstentions: 0. Six Commissioners were recused for votes on the following due to conflicts of interest: KXPR/KXJZ, Crocker Art Museum, Sacramento Poetry Center, and California Lawyers for the Arts.
- Six (6) Community Enhancement Grants approved by the Commission at their meeting of March 16, 1998: Ayes 7; Noes 0; Absent: 4; Abstentions 0.

BACKGROUND:

PURPOSE OF THE CULTURAL ARTS AWARDS PROGRAM:

- Promote excellence in arts programming;
- Enhance stability and development of Sacramento's arts organizations;
- Support the unique contributions of Sacramento's diverse communities;
- Enhance the role of the arts in economic development;
- Support a range of arts education programs;
- Ensure the arts are broadly distributed and include the underserved.

These awards provide partial project or general operating support to non-profit arts organizations, government arts agencies, and community organizations which present arts programs. Grant amounts are based on the budget size of the organization. The applications are judged by a peer review panel from the arts community, using the following criteria:

- 1) Artistic Excellence
- 2) Community Involvement
- 3) Organizational Accountability

Those organizations selected for funding met the standard of "outstanding" or "excellent" for the above criteria, and therefore have the highest priority for funding.

AD HOC COMMITTEE: Under the direction of the Commission and representatives of grantee organizations, a series of community-wide public meetings were conducted in 1995-96. This "Ad Hoc" Committee met from December through March and made recommendations to modify the policies and procedures of the Cultural Arts Awards Program. Topics reviewed included the panel process, eligibility, review criteria, request amounts, the Multicultural policy and the appeals process, among others. The Commission continues to invite community input at the annual "**Funding Options**" workshops held each fall.

TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE & OUTREACH: In May and June 1997 the Cultural Arts Awards **Guidelines & Application** were advertised and distributed. Potential applicants attended two free technical assistance seminars in July. Individual technical assistance was also provided upon request. Forty-nine applications were received by the August deadline.

THE PANELS: The **Review Panel** (Exhibit A) was composed to reflect the range of artistic disciplines, gender, age, cultural diversity and knowledge of large and small budget arts organizations. They convened November 17-20, 1997 to review, score and rank the applications (Exhibit B).

Four appeals were received by the Appeals Pre-selection Committee and three were forwarded to the **Appeals Panel** (Exhibit A) which convened on January 6, 1997. These included Fair Oaks Theater Festival, Sacramento Poetry Center, and Sacramento Youth Symphony. One appeal was accepted but no scores were changed. Appeals must be based on:

- a) Incorrect processing of the required application; and/or
- b) Misstatement of fact during the panel review.

COMMUNITY ENHANCEMENT GRANTS: The Awards Committee has identified a lack of art programs in portions of the City and County of Sacramento. The purpose of the Community Enhancement Grant (CEG) is to encourage arts services throughout the county, particularly to neighborhoods which do not currently have extensive arts activities. The goal is to reach new audiences, specifically in geographic areas not currently served by the Commission's grants programs. CEGs are restricted to those organizations which are recommended for funding under the Cultural Arts Awards Program. The CEG applications were reviewed and evaluated by the Awards Committee on February 23, 1998. Six organizations are recommended for funding (Exhibit C) based on the following criteria:

- 1) Artistic quality;
- 2) Thoroughness of planning;
- 3) Impact on the targeted neighborhood; and
- 4) Consistency with program goals.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The combined requests of the 49 applicants total \$1,486,315.

The disbursement period is from January through December, 1998. Staff recommends that any award or portion of award not used by grantees be made available to organizations through the Commission's Technical Assistance programs, particularly for small and Multicultural organizations which do not have access to the expertise needed in the grant proposal process.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATION:

Not Applicable.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS: The Arts Commission assures that everyone applying for a Cultural Arts Awards receive a benefit in the form of a grant or technical assistance (such as consultancies and workshop stipends.) Organizations not recommended for funding in 1998 (Exhibit B) will be offered free technical assistance opportunities throughout the year.


The Commission has taken measures to be more inclusive and reflective of the diverse communities in the County of Sacramento, while helping to educate and assist organizations which need specific tools to ensure their healthy growth (Exhibit D).

- Grantees include theater, music, visual, dance, arts service, folk art, media, literary, multi disciplinary, and community-based organizations.
- Cultural groups include Asian/Pacific Islander, European, Latino, African-American.

- Special populations include those which reach out to children, the gay/lesbian community, physically and developmentally challenged, and the homeless.
- All applicants conduct outreach programs to schools, senior citizens, or neighborhoods with few cultural activities.
- Several organizations produce multi disciplinary arts festivals attended by thousands of Northern Californians, enhancing the reputation of our city as they generate acclaim on a national level.

The Commission's Grant Proposal Writing Workshops continue to outreach to groups which have traditionally received little or no funding from the Commission. Six of the 1998 applicants were applying for the first time.



AGREEMENT FOR ADMINISTRATION OF
1998 SACRAMENTO CULTURAL ARTS AWARDS GRANT FUNDS

This Agreement is made and entered into the 28th day of April, 1998 by and between the City of Sacramento, a municipal corporation (hereinafter referred to as "City"), and the County of Sacramento (hereinafter referred to as "County").

Whereas the City and County of Sacramento have approved a joint Regranting program for local arts organizations called the "1998 Sacramento Cultural Arts Awards/Community Enhancement Grants"; and

Whereas the County of Sacramento is responsible for administration of contracts for the 1998 Sacramento Cultural Arts Awards/Community Enhancement Grants.

Now, therefore, the parties mutually agree as follows:

1. City shall pay to County the sum of \$110,932 which County shall regrant to recipients of the 1998 Sacramento Cultural Arts Awards / Community Enhancement Grants.
2. County shall keep all accurate and detailed books and records in connection with the services performed under this agreement, in order that the City's Director of Finance may properly audit all expenditures made pursuant to this agreement.
3. County further agrees that the City's Director of Finance shall at all times have access to all books, records, and accounts kept by County in connection with all sums expended under this agreement, for the purpose of making an audit of all expenditures made by contractor in the performance of this agreement.
4. County and the agents and employees of County, in the performance of this agreement, shall act in an independent capacity and not as officers or employees or agents of the City.
