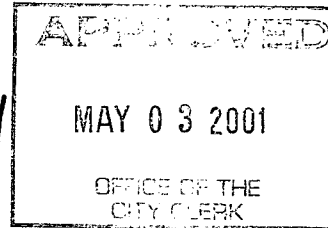

SUBJECT: ACCEPTANCE OF THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE "POLICE INTEGRITY TRAINING INITIATIVE" GRANT AWARD

LOCATION AND COUNCIL DISTRICT: City-wide.

Adopt the attached Resolution authorizing the acceptance of the Police Integrity Training Initiative grant award and augmenting the Police Department's Grant Operating Budget in the amount of \$400,000.

SUMMARY:

The City of Sacramento Police Department has been awarded \$400,000 for the Police Integrity Training Initiative federal grant funds by the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS), to be implemented by the Regional Community Policing Institute (RCPI-Sacramento). This is a one-year grant, with possible future funding. There is no City match required for this grant award.

COMMITTEE/COMMISSION ACTION

There was none required for this report.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

On March 28, 2001 the Sacramento Police Department was awarded a \$400,000 grant by the COPS Office to provide a series of Police Integrity Training workshops to law enforcement personnel. RCPI - Sacramento will conduct those workshops throughout its designated region.

The Institute, a unit of the Sacramento Police Department, is now in its fourth year of operation. In the past, RCPI has provided training on Community Oriented Policing and Problem Solving to community members and law enforcement personnel. RCPI will continue to promote this philosophy with the emphasis on Ethics and Integrity during the next grant year. Training will be offered on a variety of topics relating to Early Warning Systems, Data Collection, Use of Force, and Citizen Complaints. The goal is to develop trust and strengthen police/community relationships.

Proposed Use of Funds

As stated in the Year-Four grant proposal, RCPI - Sacramento will host nine (9) workshops throughout its region. Approximately 440 people are expected to be trained.. Technical assistance will be provided to assist law enforcement agencies in the development and delivery of Ethics and Integrity training.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

The total cost of the Police Integrity Training Initiative grant is \$400,000. The grant period will be for one year, from January 16, 2001 through January 15, 2002. No City match is required.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS

This proposal does not constitute a "project" and is therefore exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines, Sections 15061(b)(1), 15378(b)(3).

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

Acceptance of the grant award is in accordance with prior City Council actions relative to state and federal grant awards. Acceptance of these funds will allow the Police Department to continue its efforts, through RCPI-Sacramento, to provide effective training which strengthens law enforcement

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ACCEPT A \$400,000 GRANT AWARD FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE, OFFICE OF COMMUNITY ORIENTED POLICING SERVICES FOR THE POLICE INTEGRITY TRAINING INITIATIVE.

WHEREAS the City of Sacramento will provide Police Integrity Training workshops to be funded from funds made available through the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Sacramento that:

1. The City Manager, or a designated representative is hereby authorized to execute a grant award on behalf of the City of Sacramento, from the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services in the amount of \$400,000 including any extensions or amendments thereof, to implement the Police Integrity Training Initiative.
2. The Grant Operating Budget will be increased by a total of \$400,000 as follows:
