

SUBJECT: Turf Tractor

After careful evaluation of the three (3) bids submitted for the turf tractor, we recommend the contract be awarded to H. V. Carter Company, Inc., to purchase a Jacobsen Model G-10 which meets all specification without exception.

Bids submitted by Case and Ford do not meet specifications in some of the most critical areas and are counter productive in other areas as described in memorandum from Don Eckels attached. Furthermore these tractors weigh considerably more than the Jacobsen G-10 which is an undesirable feature and the driver sits higher off the ground subjecting himself to an unsafe condition when mowing near trees with low hanging branches.

Currently we have one (1) Ford Model 531 tractor in use at the Haggin Oaks Golf Course. It has been in service for approximately three years and has not proven to be the most suitable type of equipment for our intended purpose. In light of the above reasons we are requesting purchase of the Jacobsen Model G-10.

Re: Tractor (Turf) bid by JI Case

We find the Case 380CK LCG Tractor to be unequal to the specifications for Tractor (Turf) #124 dated November 28, 1979 in the following:

Paragraph 11.0 Dimensions C. Width (overall) - 84" approximately." The Case exceeds the width dimensions requiring the tractor to abut right against curbs and walks to mow the adjacent turf. The Case will then be tracking right over the usual location of sprinkler heads. The Case would definitely increase the number of broken sprinkler heads we experience from mowing activities. Our present tractor can stay 24 inches away from curbs and walks and cut the adjacent turf.

Paragraph 11.6 Rear Axle: provides for "approximately 25 mph road speed." The Case 380CK LCG Tractor can make only 15.01 mph road speed per the Case specification. This is 40% less than 25 mph and has significant negative impact on Special Service flexibility to mow the turf in widely scattered parks on a timely, scheduled basis.

Paragraph 11.7 Tires and Wheels: provides a. "Front - two (2) 6.70 x 15, 4 ply wide base or equal." The Case has 7.50 x 10 front tires and will wear excessively due to more rotations to cover the street miles between parks. b. "Rear - four (4) 7.50 x 16 turf traction type." The Case tractor has two (2) 18.4 x 16.1 rear tires. These tires knock down too much grass as compared to the specified tires and result in a much poorer quality of mowing. We also find the Case 380CK LCG at 4375 pounds in combination with its wheels will increase soil compaction and result in added deterioration of the turf in our parks.
