RESOLUTION URGING THE UNITED STATES SENATE TO APPROVE THE DURHAM BILL (HR 7576) PROVIDING FOR THE ASSUMPTION OF ADDED RESPONSIBILITY BY THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT IN THE FINANCING AND DIRECTION OF A MORE EFFECTIVE NATIONAL CIVIL DEFENSE PLAN.

WHEREAS, the Durham Bill (HR 7576) providing for the assumption of added responsibilities by the Federal Government in the financing and direction of a more effective National Civil Defense Plan, has been passed by the House of Representatives; and

7930

WHEREAS, The Burham Bill (HR 7576) will be up for consideration by the United States Senate during the current session of the 85th Congress and

WHEREAS, the amendments proposed to the Federal Civil Defense law do the following:

1. Changes the concept of Civil Defense to one of joint responsibility of Federal, State and Local Governments rather than the primary responsibility of state and local governments alone.
2. Would authorize, for the first time, Federal sharing on a 50-50 basis of local costs for administration and personnel.
3. Authorizes a 50 percent Federal contribution for training of personnel in lieu of the present \$100 ceiling per student.
4. Continues the present 50-50 formula for capital expenditures.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

January 9, 1958

That it is the consensus of opinion of the members of the City Council of the City of Sacramento that said Durham Bill (HR 7576) now pending before the Senate of the United States, if passed, will be of great assistance in furthering the Civil Defense program of the City of Sacramento, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

Urgently requests the Senate of the United States to give favorable consideration to the passage of this Bill (HR 7576). That copies of the Resolution be forwarded to Senator RICHARD B. RUSSELL, CHAIRMAN OF ARMED SERVICES COMMITTEE OF THE UNITED STATES SENATE, to SENATORS WILLIAM F. KNOWLAND and THOMAS H. KUCHEL, the Senators from California, and to REPRESENTATIVE JOHN E. MOSS, JR., of the Third Congressional District.

Seconded by Councilman Shelby and carried by the following vote:

That the City Manager is hereby authorized to purchase for the Fire Department FIRE ENGINE TRUCK PARTS, in the open market without first advertising for bids, pursuant to Section 251 of the City Charter. Said parts are needed in order to put a fire engine back into service. The cost of said truck parts is the sum of \$2810.94. Such course is recommended by the City Manager.

That there is hereby appropriated out of AVAILABLE FUNDS the sum of \$2810.94 to cover cost of the purchase of said truck parts.

WHEREAS, it is deemed wise and expedient to invest such funds in Bills of the United States of America,

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

That the City Treasurer is hereby authorized and instructed to purchase United States Treasury Bills of a face value of \$500,000.00 maturing April 10, 1958, or any less sum as required by the United States of America.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all actions heretofore taken by the City Treasurer to accomplish the above purchase by and the same are hereby ratified.

WHEREAS, our Creator has seen fit to remove from our world on January 8, 1958, Fred Grumm, member and Chairman of the Redevelopment Agency of the City of Sacramento; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Grumm has conscientiously, diligently, faithfully and without compensation served the City of Sacramento since December 3, 1950 as a member of the Redevelopment Agency through its initial planning and execution states. This followed his long, successful and eminent career as an engineer for the Highway Department of the State of California; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Grumm has rendered important service of high quality made possible by the breadth and practicality of his extensive experience; and

WHEREAS, the pleasant, warm, generous personality of Fred Grumm endeared him to his fellow men in performing a high public service, his life having been marked with sound judgment and good performance; and

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Sacramento in regular meeting this 9th day of January, 1958, record with sorrow the passing of one of Sacramento's esteemed citizens. The deep sympathy of the City Council and City Government is extended to Mr. Grumm's surviving wife and two sons; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of the resolution, fully executed by all members of the City Council be delivered to Mrs. Grumm; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that when the City Council adjourn its instant meeting, it do so out of respect to the memory of Mr. Fred Grumm.
