SUBJECT: ACCEPTANCE OF THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE "REGIONAL
COMMUNITY POLICING INSTITUTE" SECOND YEAR GRANT AWARD

LOCATION AND COUNCIL DISTRICT: City-wide.

Adopt the attached Resolution authorizing the acceptance of the Regional Community Policing Institute (RCPI) grant award augmenting the Police Department's Grant Operating Budget in the amount of \$750,000.

SUMMARY:

The City of Sacramento Police Department has been awarded \$750,000 in second-year federal grant funds by the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) under the Regional Community Policing Institutes (RCPI) program. The grant period is for one year, with the possibility of third year funding. There is no City match required for this grant award.

COMMITTEE/COMMISSION ACTION:

There was none required for this report.

The mission of the Sacramento Police Department is to work in partnership with the Community to protect life and property; solve neighborhood problems, and enhance the quality of life in our City.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

In August of 1997, the Sacramento Police Department was awarded a \$1,000,000 grant by the COPS Office to establish the Regional Community Policing Institute of Sacramento. RCPI - Sacramento was formally established in October 1997 with the assignment of the following police department staff: One (1) Police Captain, one (1) Police Sergeant, two (2) Administrative Analysts, and one (1) Police Clerk.

The principle mission of RCPI - Sacramento is to "enhance implementation of the community policing philosophy throughout the region by providing quality community policing training and an accessible resource clearinghouse to law enforcement, community members and local government agencies" in a 48-county region from approximately Monterey County north to the Oregon border. In it's first year RCPI held three train-the-trainer workshops in basic community oriented policing for over 400 people. Forty-two percent of workshop attendance were "non-sworn" individuals from a variety of agencies and community members. RCPI also sponsored a Community Partnership for Safety Forum in August with over 150 community members in attendance.

Partners

Principal partners of RCPI - Sacramento include: the California Attorney General's Office; the California Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training; California State University, Sacramento Institute for Social Research; and the Sacramento County Alliance of Neighborhoods. RCPI - Sacramento also works closely with the San Diego Police and Los Angeles County Sheriff's Departments' RCPI's. A Local Coordination Council consisting of community members and organizations also meets quarterly to oversee and make recommendations on RCPI's activities.

Proposed Use of Funds

As required, RCPI - Sacramento will continue training activities in the second year including two more basic community policing workshops, as well as 12 specialized workshops in community policing for dispatchers, supervisors, youth and civilian employees, and neighborhood revitalization. A second Community Partnership for Safety Forum is tentatively scheduled for April 1999.

The long-term goal of the COPS Office and the Sacramento Police Department is for the Regional Community Policing Institute to be "institutionalized" into the department so that standardized and state-of-the-art training in community oriented policing can be continued.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The total RCPI program cost is \$750, 000. The grant period will be for one year. There is a possibility of third year funding. No City match is required.


POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:

MBE/WBE EFFORTS:


Materials and services will be procured in accordance with the City's MBE/WBE policy.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ACCEPT A \$750,000 GRANT AWARD FROM THE FEDERAL "REGIONAL COMMUNITY POLICING INSTITUTE" PROGRAM FOR SECOND YEAR FUNDING

WHEREAS the City of Sacramento desires to continue the Regional Community Policing Institute - Sacramento project to be funded from funds made available through the U.S. Department of Justice Office of Community Oriented Policing Services Regional Community Policing Institutes program.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Sacramento that:

1. The City Manager, or a designated representative is hereby authorized to execute a grant award on behalf of the City of Sacramento, from the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services in the amount of \$750,000 including any extensions or amendments thereof, to implement the Regional Community Policing Institute - Sacramento.
2. The Grant Operating Budget will be increased by a total of \$750,000 as follows:
