STAFF RECOMMENDATION

The Police Department recommends that the City Council adopt the attached resolution approving an agreement with the Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) to provide services to the Police Department's Regional Community Policing Institute (RCPI). The effective dates of the contract will be May 13, 1998 to August 21, 1998. The total contract amount will not exceed \$150,150.00.

SUMMARY

The Police Department is seeking approval to execute an agreement with POST in the total amount not to exceed \$150,150.00 to provide curriculum development and certification services, and to handle reimbursements for all RCPI workshop attendees throughout the RCPI region. This agreement will be in effect from May 13, 1998 to August 21, 1998. This agreement also allows POST to continue handling training reimbursements until November 30, 1998 if an extension is

granted to RCPI from the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS), the grantor.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

On August 21, 1997, the Police Department received a \$1 million grant from the COPS Office to form the Regional Community Policing Institute. Acceptance of this grant was previously approved by the City Council on August 26, 1997. The goal of RCPI is to provide state-of-the-art training in Community Oriented Policing and Problem Solving during 2-day workshops scheduled throughout the RCPI's designated region of Central and Northern California. Teams of law enforcement personnel, government officials and citizens are encouraged to attend. To ensure that this training is widely accessible, workshops are offered free of charge.

One of RCPI's partners is POST who is providing curriculum development and course certification services, as well as handling course reimbursements of trainees attending RCPI's workshops. POST will dedicate a Senior Consultant to assist in the development of the RCPI workshop curriculum and the POST certification of the RCPI courses. The City is also authorized and funded by the COPS Office to reimburse all students for their travel and per diem expenses while attending RCPI training. POST will process all workshop attendees' travel and per diem reimbursements. The cost for these services during the life of the grant will not exceed \$48,750.00. The total funds allowed for student travel and per diem reimbursements processed through POST will not exceed \$101,400.00. The total contract amount will not exceed \$150,150.00 and will be paid by the grant. (A copy of the contract is on file in the City Clerk's Office.)

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

The total contract amount will not exceed \$150,150.00. Payments to POST for services rendered will not exceed \$48,750.00. Reimbursement amounts handled by POST will not exceed \$101,400.00. All funds for the total contract amount will be provided through the RCPI grant from the COPS Office.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

Approval of this agreement is consistent with past practices. The Police Department has previously worked with other agencies on grant projects. Approval of this contract will allow RCPI to provide POST certified training and reimbursements to RCPI workshop attendees.
