

RESOLUTION NO. 2743

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the City Council of the City of Sacramento, public interest and convenience require that the work and improvement hereinafter described, in the City of Sacramento, State of California, should be done;

NOW, THEREFORE, the said City Council of the City of Sacramento does hereby resolve and declare that it is the intention of the said City Council to order the following work and improvement to be done in said City, to-wit:

TO CLOSE, VACATE, AND ABANDON, the following Avenues and Unnamed Roads in Colonial Acres No. 3 and Colonial Acres No. 4 (as the same are shown on the official Plats thereof filed in the office of the Sacramento County Recorder), in the City of Sacramento, described as follows:

RAILROAD AVENUE from the Westerly boundary of Colonial Acres No. 3 to the Easterly boundary of said Colonial Acres No. 3;

CARTER AVENUE from the Westerly boundary of said Colonial Acres No. 3 to the Easterly boundary of said Colonial Acres No. 3;

MARTIN AVENUE from the Westerly boundary of said Colonial Acres No. 3 to the Westerly line of Jessie Avenue;

JESSIE AVENUE from the Southerly line of Railroad Avenue to a point located 697.92 feet Northerly from the center line of Fruitridge Road;

HERBERT AVENUE from the Southerly line of Railroad Avenue to the Northerly line of Martin Avenue;

A 40 FOOT UNNAMED ROAD bordering along the Northerly line of Lots 1, 16, 17, 32, and 33 of said Colonial Acres No. 4;

A 40 FOOT UNNAMED ROAD bordering along the Northerly line of Lots 5,

12, 21, 28, 37, 44, and 53 of said Colonial Acres No. 4;

A 40 FOOT UNNAMED ROAD bordering along the Easterly line of Lots

1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8 of said Colonial Acres No. 4,

EXCEPTING a portion of said unnamed road
lying 697.41 feet northerly from the center
line of Fruitridge Road;

A 40 FOOT UNNAMED ROAD bordering along the Easterly line of

Lots 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23 and 24 of said Colonial Acres No. 4;

A 40 FOOT UNNAMED ROAD bordering along the Westerly line of

Lots 41, 42, 43, 44, 45, 49, 50, 51, and 52 of said Colonial Acres No. 4;

And said City Council does hereby determine and declare that said proposed work and improvement is of more than local or ordinary benefit, and will affect and benefit the lands and District herein-
after described, and which said District is hereby declared to be the District affected and benefited by said work and improvement and that therefore the entire damages, costs, and expenses of said work and improvement shall be and are hereby made chargeable against, and shall be Assessed upon said lands and district, which district is within the City of Sacramento, County of Sacramento, State of California, and the exterior boundaries of the lands affected and benefited by said work and improvement are particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Bounded on the North by Railroad Avenue and a 40 foot
unnamed road bordering along the Northerly
line of Lots 1, 16, 17, 32 and 33 of said Colonial
Acres No. 4;
On the East by the Easterly boundary of said Colonial
Acres No. 4;
On the South by Fruitridge Road;
On the West by the Westerly boundary of Colonial Acres
No. 3 and the Southerly production thereof to
the northerly line of Fruitridge Road.


And the City Council does hereby elect to proceed to do said work under the provisions of Division 9 Part 3 "Streets and Highways Code, THE STREET VACATION ACT OF 1941", being an Act of Legislature of the State of California, Approved May 13, 1941; and hereby fixes the 11th day of March, 1949 at 8:00 o'clock P.M., in the

City Council Chamber in the Sacramento City Hall on I Street, between 9th and 10th Streets of said City, as the time and place when and where any and all persons interested in said work and improvement may appear before the said City Council of said City and be heard by said City Council upon such appeal, and show cause, if any they have, why the said Improvement should not be made.

The Sacramento Union is hereby designated as the daily newspaper published and circulated in said City, in which this RESOLUTION shall be published; and the Superintendent of Streets is hereby directed to post notice of the passage of this Resolution in the manner prescribed by Law.
