**SUBJECT: START FUNDING CONTRACT WITH THE CALIFORNIA  
DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION**

**LOCATION: City-wide**

This report recommends that the City Council, by Resolution, authorize the City Manager to execute a contract with the State of California, Department of Education, for 1998-99 State funding of the START program in the amount of \$1,587,644.

**SUMMARY**

The State of California, Department of Education, provides funding for literacy based school age programs. The State has awarded the City of Sacramento \$1.58 million for 1998-99. This report provides the contract to accept that funding.

**BACKGROUND**

The City of Sacramento has been a statewide leader in providing the after school literacy program, START. The START program creates a safe and supervised after school literacy/enrichment program at 29 sites throughout Sacramento in collaboration with five

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different school districts within the City's boundaries. The START program is funded through a combination of city, county, state and federal government funds, school districts, private foundations, community based organization, and individual donors and volunteers. The five participating school districts in the City of Sacramento include the Sacramento Unified School District, Del Paso Elementary School District, Elk Grove Unified School District, Natomas Unified School District and North Sacramento School District.

This is the second year that the City has received funding for START from the California Department of Education.

### **FINANCIAL CONSIDERATION**

The California Department of Education is contributing \$1,587,644 for FY 1998-99. This funding will be used at 12 of the 29 sites. In March 1998, the City received notification of this grant award and, therefore, approved the funding as part of the FY 1998-99 budget preparation. Therefore, all necessary budget and staffing augmentation forms have been completed.

Staff is optimistic that funding from the State of California will continue for the START program in future years.

### **POLICY CONSIDERATIONS**

The START program is consistent with the City Council direction of improving the quality of life in Sacramento for all families and providing positive activities for youth. The program is also an excellent example of partnerships with the community, other government agencies, and the private sector to improve children's educational opportunities.


### **ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS**
