**SUBJECT: 2ND AVENUE REALIGNMENT AND TRAFFIC SIGNAL PROJECT(PN:XXXX) -
REJECT BIDS**

LOCATION AND COUNCIL DISTRICT:

2nd Avenue between Stockton Boulevard and 45th Street. Council District 5.

RECOMMENDATION:

This report recommends that the City Council reject bids for the 2nd Avenue Realignment and Traffic Signal Project.

SUMMARY:

Bids were received on August 20, 1997. All exceeded the engineer's estimate. The majority of the project cost is funded by the University of California Regents. Postponing the construction of this project until next spring will eliminate potential delays due to inclement weather, reduce public inconvenience and likely result in less cost. The project will be re-bid in early 1998.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The project will realign 2nd Avenue east of Stockton Boulevard and construct a traffic signal at the intersection.

This project was advertised and bids were received on August 20, 1997, and are summarized below:

- The Engineer's estimate was \$677,548.
- This project will be re-bid in early 1998.

A funding agreement between the City and the University of California Regents will be approved prior to contract award.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS:

A Negative Declaration was approved for the project by the University of California Regents.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:

The action requested herein is consistent with Sacramento City Code, Title 58.


2nd Avenue Realignment and Traffic Signal Project

The project was also announced on the Project Information Line and on the City's Internet site at www.sacto.org/bids. Project notices were sent to 30 organizations involved in MBE/WBE recruitment.
