19th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution (Women's Right to Vote) 80th Anniversary

WHEREAS, women did not have the right to vote for the first one-hundred and forty four (144) years of the life of the United States of America; and

WHEREAS, women contributed to the birth of this country and the continuing fight for civil and human rights and deserved complete and total access to the electoral process; and

WHEREAS, many women and their allies suffered physical, mental, and emotional deprivation in the struggle to gain the right to vote; and


WHEREAS, women and their allies worked and struggled for decades to pass a constitutional amendment to gain the right to vote; and


WHEREAS, women continue to contribute to the struggle for a more just and democratic society; and






