RESOLUTION REGARDING THE HOSTING OF THE ALTERNATE OLYMPICS

WHEREAS, widespread support for the City of Sacramento to host the Alternate Olympics has been acknowledged by local officials and the greater Sacramento community; and

WHEREAS, initial community support has included practical, down-to-earth statements of fact from the General Manager of the Sacramento Community Center, the Chancellor of the Los Rios Community College District, from the Sacramento Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce, among others; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor's staff has been checking into the possibility of complimentary housing for athletes and staff at nearby colleges, Air Force Bases and the U. S. Army Depot; and

WHEREAS, since Sacramento has the only all-weather, ten-lane track in the country as well as a newly remodeled sports stadium seating 22,000; and

WHEREAS, since the Police Department had indicated that it could provide the Alernate Olympic's special security needs at no significant local costs; and

WHEREAS, Sacramento has the qualities needed for a successful Alternate Olympics and would welcome the opportunity to make this gesture as well as to realize the added revenues such a financial venture could contribute to the area;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SACRAMENTO CITY COUNCIL that it is in favor of supporting a bid to host the Alternate Olympics in this city.
