The Sacramento Employment and Training Agency (SETA) Governing Board has approved an action that requires the review and approval of your body before such action is considered final and authorized. Under the Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement, SETA/PIC is required to request authority from the Partners (The City of Sacramento and the County of Sacramento) to accept any form of financial assistance and the operation and administration by the Agency of any human service program other than those specifically authorized pursuant to the Agreement.

The Sacramento Employment and Training Agency is the designated grantee for number of grants to provide services to Sacramento City and County residents. For the last four years, SETA/PIC has been a collaborative partner in the Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Agency's (SHRA) application to the U. S. 

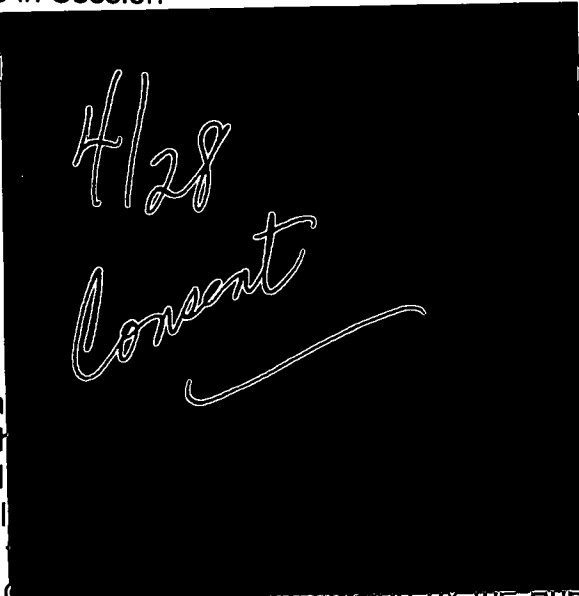
